Both Wo Wo and Troy will be providing music Friday and Saturday nights. Wo Wo will provide additional music for the afternoon on Saturday. Saturday activities will kick off with our annual parade at 11:00AM, hosting a grand performance by the Nicodemus Buffalo Soldiers Association re-enactment troop. Following the parade at noon, the National Park Service is sponsoring Dr. Boyer of Kansas State University as guest speaker for the afternoon program. He will talk about the contribution of African Americans to the history of Kansas. A descendants fashion show will be hosted at 2:00 and at 5:00 an old fashion softball game will be held in the Nicodemus baseball diamond. A descendants team will be organized to play against a Hays team. Those who wish to hear some spirited gospel music are encouraged to join in the Gospel Extravaganza at 7:00 Saturday evening at the Nicodemus First Baptist Church. The National Park Service will sponsor an exhibit on Nicodemus for those who wish to get a bit of history and see historic photos.

Sunday services will be held at 10:00AM at the Nicodemus First Baptist Church with visiting minister, Rev. Lorenzo Steward and congregation from Peaceful Rest church of Denver, Colorado. A free community dinner will be serve following church services, at the Township Hall. Everyone welcome to attend. Donations accepted.
