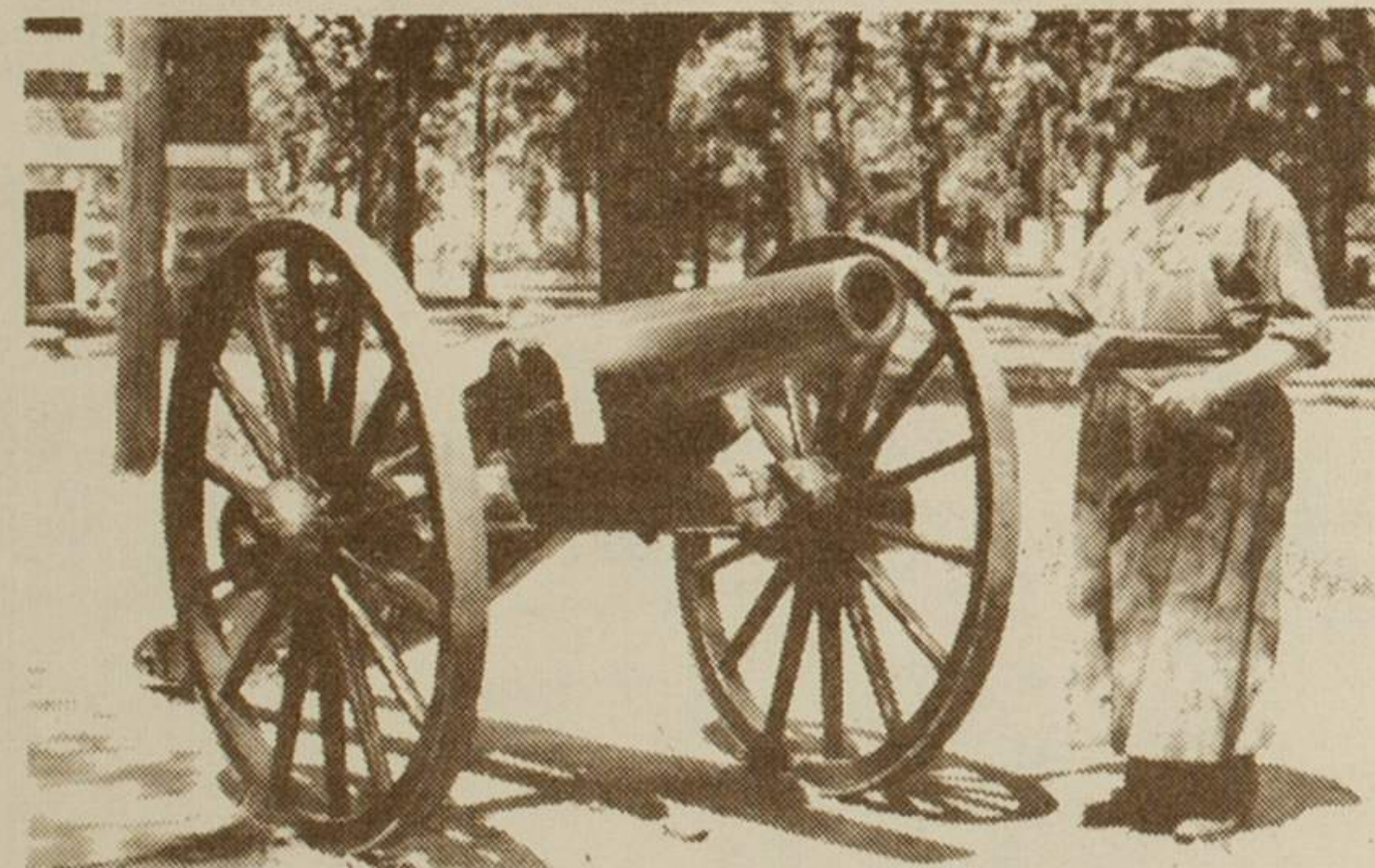




Quantrill's Massacre

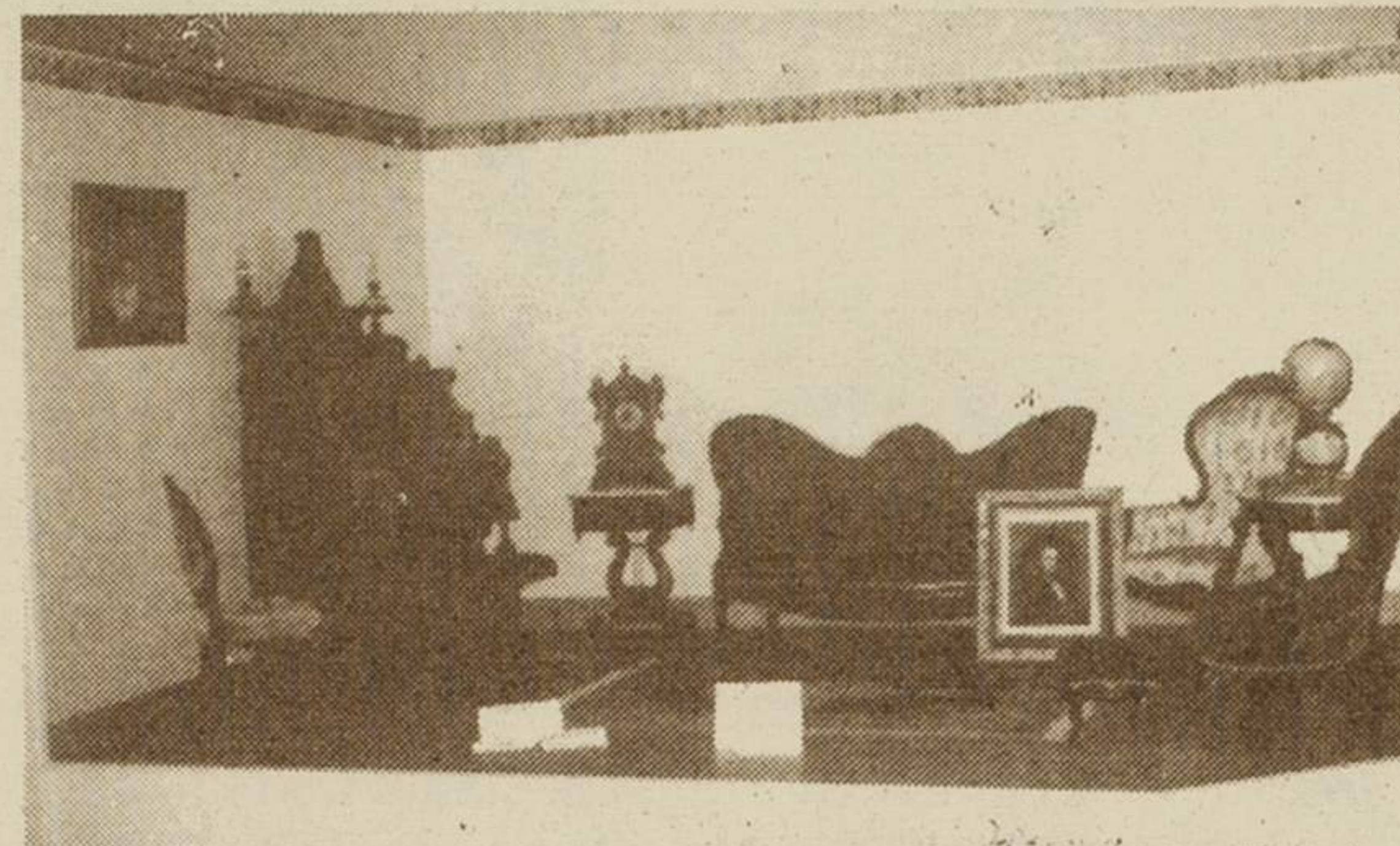

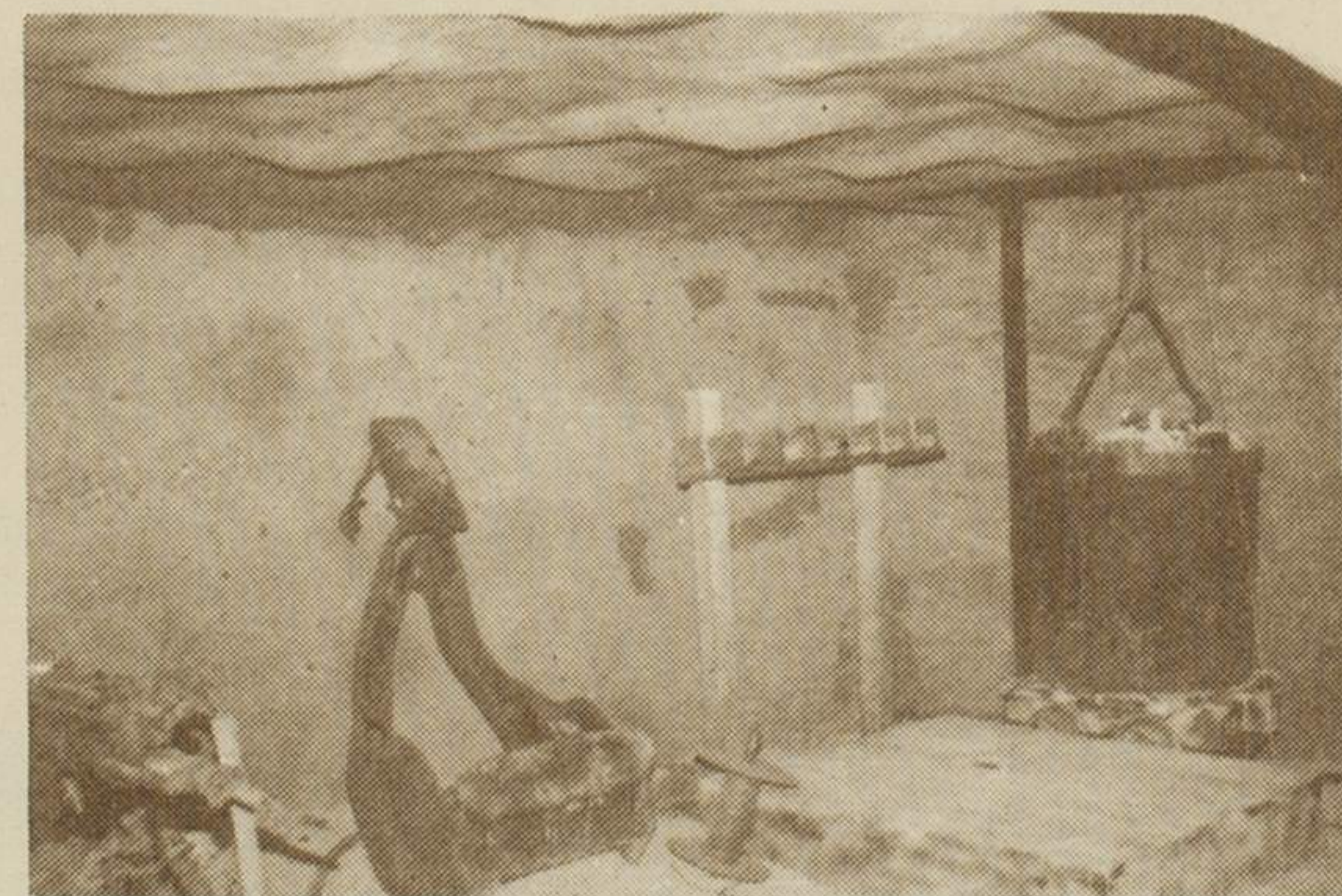

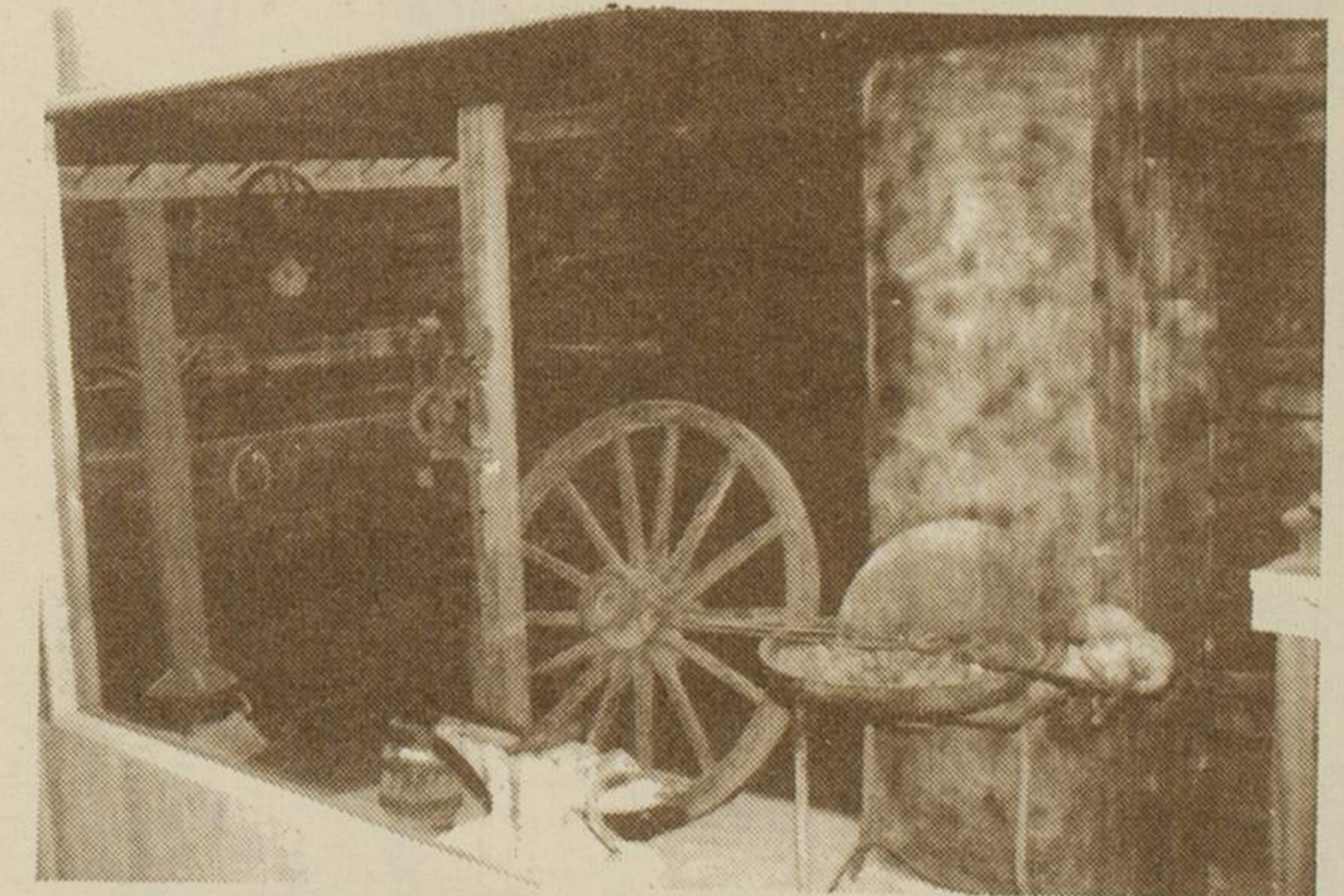


Visit the reconstructed pre-Civil War Cabin
