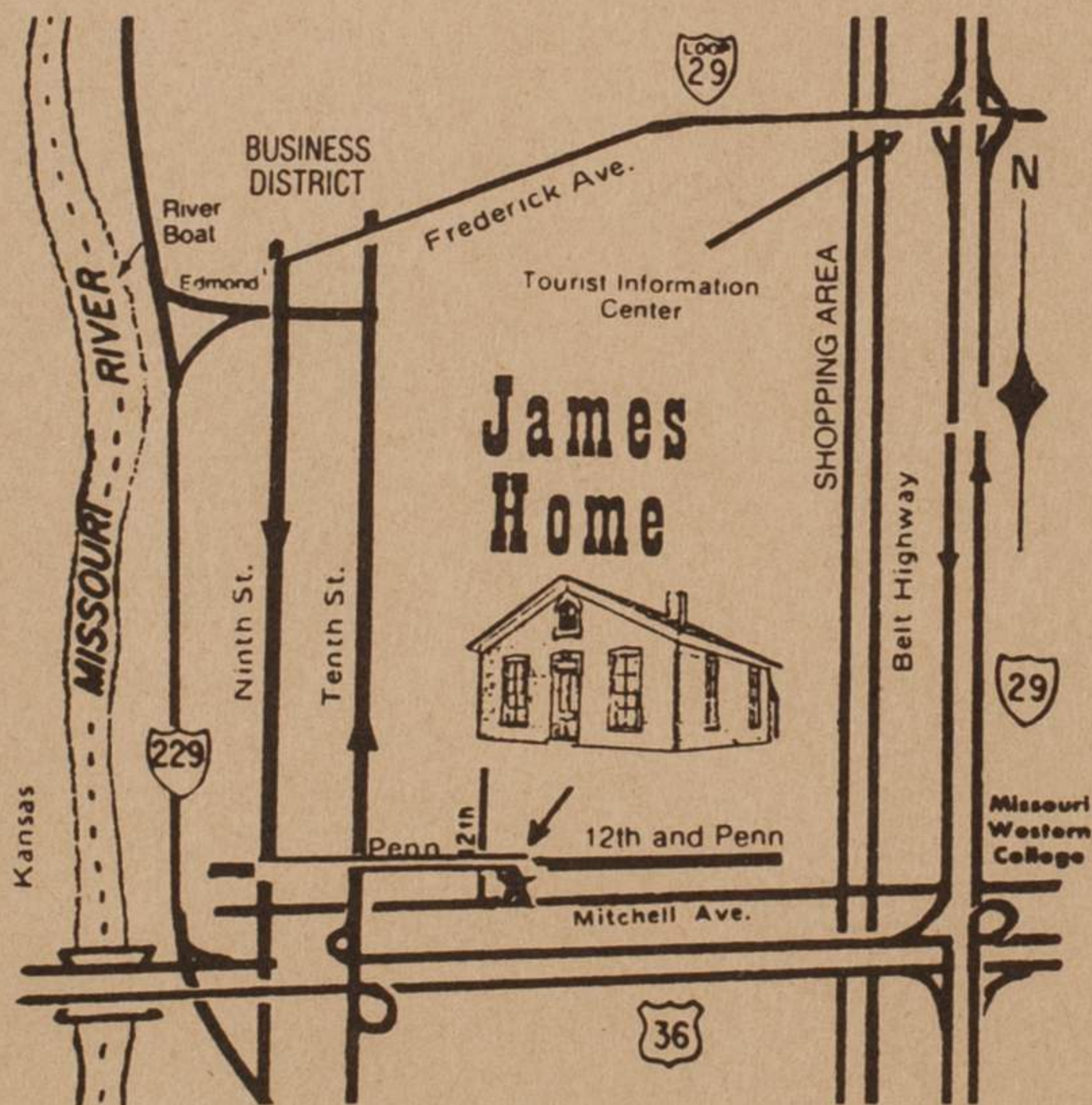


The James Home was originally located about two blocks north of its present location, at 1318 Lafayette street, on a high hill overlooking Patee House. In 1939 it was moved to the Belt Highway as a tourist attraction.

In 1977, the James Home was purchased by Mr. and Mrs. Robert Keatley and donated to the Pony Express Historical Association. The house was moved back to its original neighborhood, and it today located behind Patee House Museum.



Located 5 minutes from I-29. Take U.S. 36 west to the 10th street exit, then 6 blocks north & 2 blocks east.

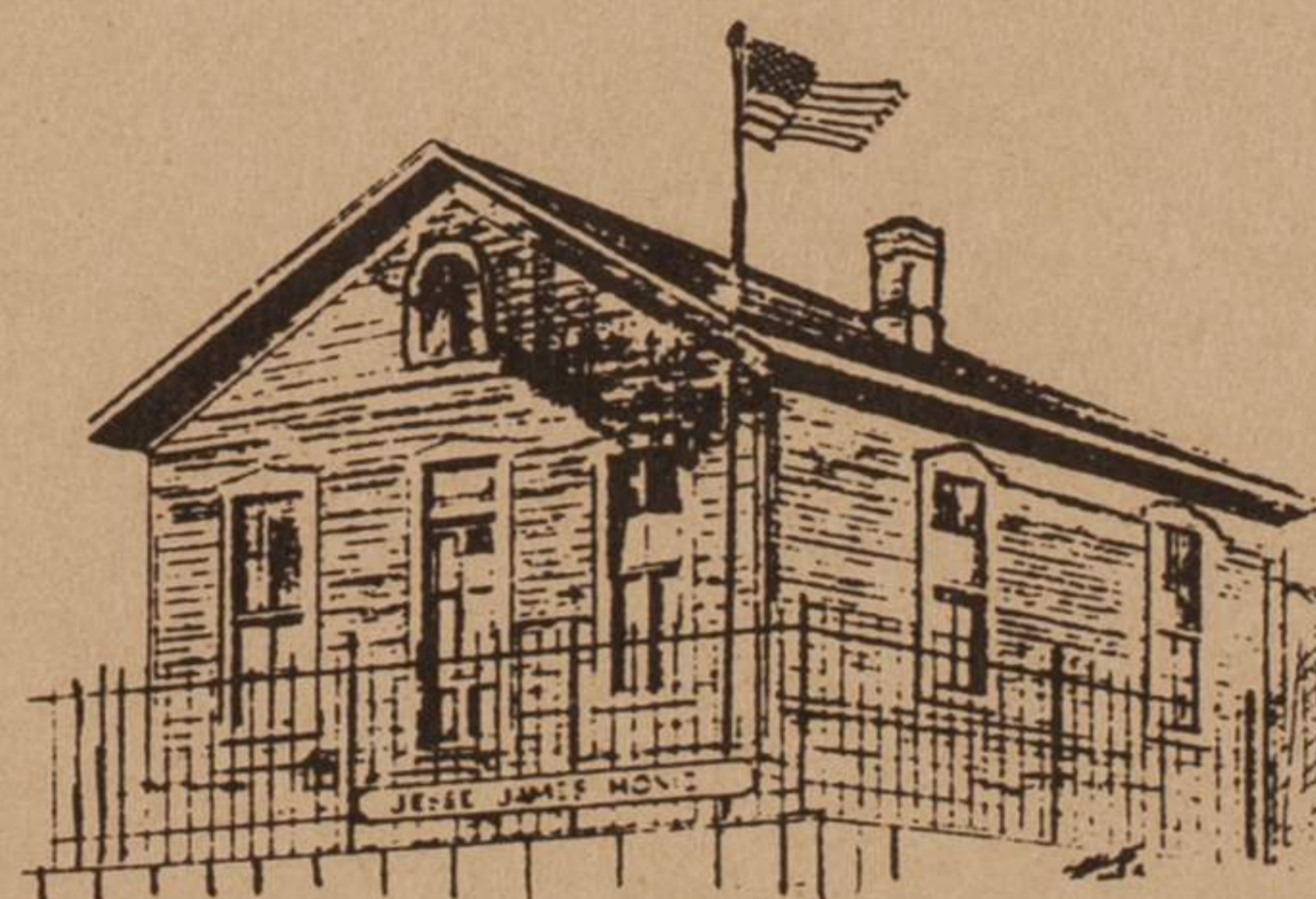
