The Kansas Library Network Board recognizes that steps need to be taken to preserve the recorded heritage of Kansas. The KLNBPreservation Committee has been working toward the goal of developing a cooperative plan for Kansas.

This Pre-conference featuring Ms. Margaret Child, a nationally known preservation consultant, will highlight what other states are doing, what Kansas could accomplish and what should be in a state-wide preservation plan for Kansas.

The Kansas Preservation Advisory committee will be introduced.
