## DOMINICAN SCARE UP AGAIN

WASHINGTON.—(ANP)— The department of state announced Wednesday that a "mystery ship" flying flags of Honduras is detained in Baltimore harbor after the department refused to issue a license to its owner. Rumors are spread that the ship is being used to smuggle arms to insurgent groups allegedly plotting an uprising in Dominican Republic, but customs officials searched it without finding any trace of guns and ammuntion.
