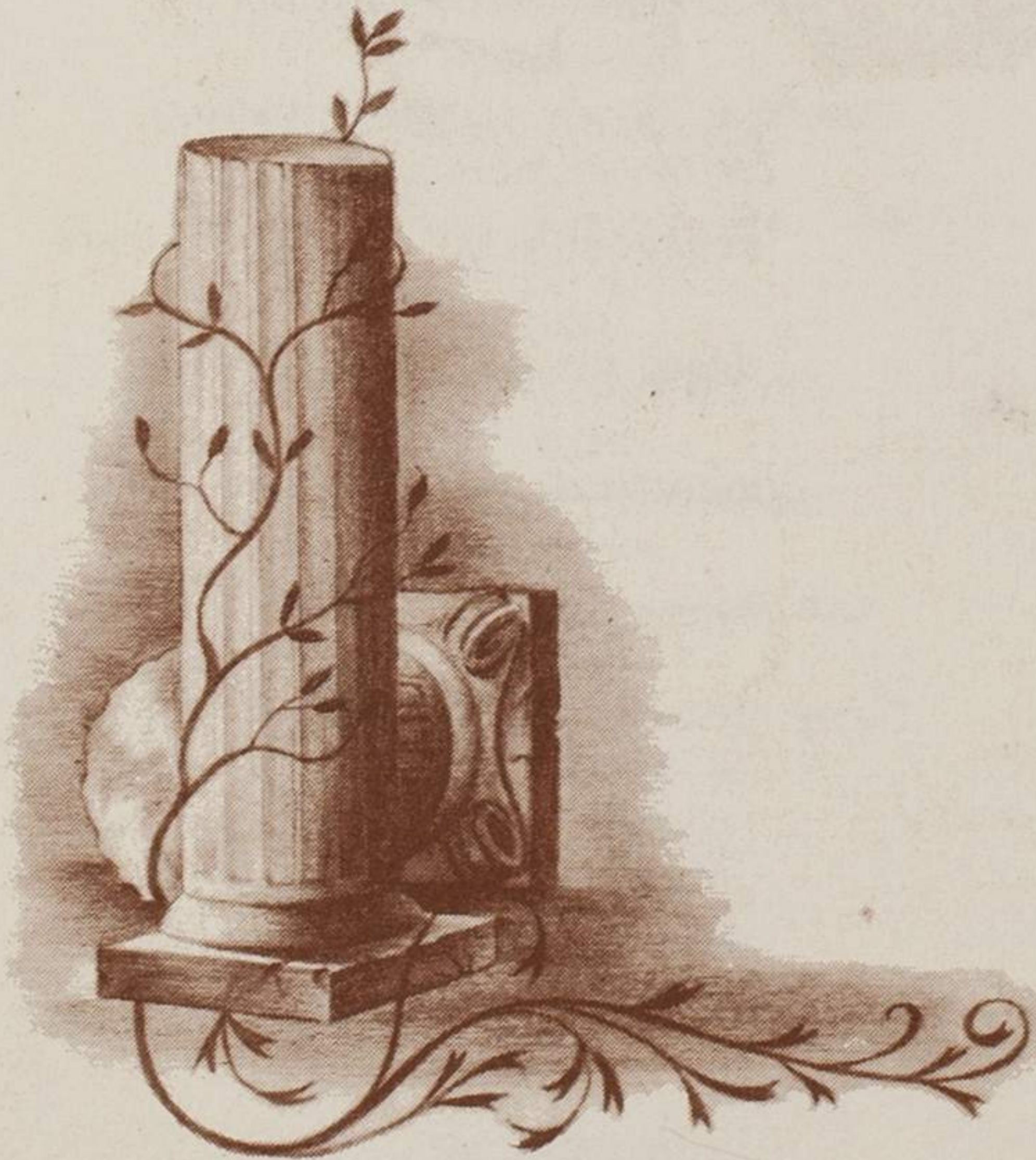
Rock of Ages, cleft for me,
