Dear D. K.:

We are having some difficulty in arranging our finances for the trip. Southern Methodist University has offered us \$400 for the two games at Dallas on the 19th and 20th of December, and you have offered us \$200 for one game and \$350 for two games on December 16th and 17th.

If we could persuade you to raise your guarantee to \$400 for two games we could somehow make the trip without playing anybody else, other than the two schools. It seems as if the guarantees are small at the other places, and we would just arrange to come down and play you and S.M.U. We desire to carry a little larger squad than we would in a regular playing season due to the fact that just before the team is picked it makes it difficult to cut down too close at such an early date.

Will you kindly hold this letter until you get into a generous mood - we hope - and then answer it? I will appreciate the extra \$50.00 if you can cut it. Then we would like to play you on a reciprocal guarantee either the following year or the next year, whenever you could come up our way. I do not think it makes any difference so long as you get the same amount of money when you come here, and we would certainly want you up here.
