We will not have all of our students back here on January 3, but I am quite anxious to play the University of Utah here because we desire to make a western trip either next year or the year following.

Would it be acceptable to you to offer you \$150.00 for the game here with an option of fifty per cent of the gate receipts, the student tickets counted at 20¢ a piece in the total receipts? We would be willing to play you at Salt Lake City under the same arrangements when we make our trip west.
