I will write to Quig tonight and sew.



Ab Hinshaw is leaving the country soon and is taking no games in this part of the country, which leaves us right where we started as far as officials are concerned.


I know you were not especially impressed with Ogden last year, but he is the only official all coaches in our conference O.K.ed for this year.


