
Dear Dr. Allen:

Dear Hank:

Thanks for your good letter of July 23. I am going in to Kansas City today to have luncheon with Harry Welsh, the president of the Alumni Association of the University of Missouri. They are still hanging on, wanting Missouri to play with us in that double-header with the Pre-Flight School and Great Lakes.

I tried every way imaginable to get Tony Hinkle to come to Kansas City on the 29th and meet you there while we meet Pre-Flight School and then the next night we would alternate, playing Great Lakes and you play Pre-Flight School - Bernie Bierman's outfit. Hinkle insisted on closing with George Edwards at Columbia on the 29th with his Great Lakes team. That was the thing that blew our party up.

Then Hinkle tried to suggest to me that he thought we would draw a good crowd if we made the same arrangements that I mentioned, in regard to Missouri, instead of Oklahoma A. & M. That is where I balked and that is where we are at the present time. Since we leased the Municipal Auditorium I felt the host school had a right to say something about the arrangements. If Hinkle ever says anything to you about it you can tell him, if you care to, why we would not have the biggest double-header set-up imaginable.

I am explaining to you why it would be impossible for A. & M. to play the Iowa school on January 30, because George Edwards arranged to play them at Columbia, Missouri. They are going there after our game on the 29th. But had Tony Hinkle agreed to the original proposition this would have all been worked out in our favor and in yours. Missouri awakened and found that Kansas was playing in Kansas City while they were playing in Columbia, Missouri. And then they wanted to come in on our party.



I am sorry that it will be impossible to see you this summer, but I do want to see you this fall and talk with you regarding the New York situation. I was hoping to give a good account of ourselves there, but last night I received word that several of our boys who were too tall for the Army and Navy are to be drafted. Their number is up. I think it is too bad that a boy that is too tall and will not be accepted by the service on account of his height is drafted by the same service.


Dear Doc,

Gentlemen:

The Directors in their recent meeting March 1st in Kansas City took up the following matters that relate to basketball.

1. The Directors voted basketball scouting, but limited it to one man on one game with a total scouting of Big Six games not to exceed four games.
2. The Directors disapproved the request of the basketball coaches for twenty games of basketball.
3. The limit of players on the home squad used in conference basketball games was removed. (If we desire that the limit on travelling squads be raised from ten to eleven, we had better take this up in the meeting March 22nd.)
4. The basketball coaches shall submit a minimum of ten officials on a preferential basis to the Commissioner of Officials for appointment in basketball games. (Last spring when we asked that the Commissioner of Officials in football take over the assignment of basketball officials, our request was that the procedure we have followed for the past three years be continued. Apparently the sentiment of the Directors was against this, as you can see from their motion. This plan we shall now follow is the plan that is being used in the Big Ten.
5. The basketball schedules for 1943 shall be made out at the December, 1941 meeting of the Big Six, and no games shall be scheduled the night of December 6th.
