Dear Earl:

I am turning over the Lt. Krickhan, Jr., correspondence and asking that you handle the matter.

When we turned in the expense account I want to explain that due to the uncertainty of early morning train travel for Camp Crowder on the Kansas City Southern, which left rather early, we went up the evening before. The boys went to a show and ate a meal in the evening. Then we ate breakfast, and caught the Southern Belle for Neosho.

We were met by the Camp Crowder people, including Lt. Krickhan, and driven out to the camp. We ate at the Reception Center and paid for our meals, and stayed at the barracks for the night, but we caught a 4 o'clock train out, which was late. We ate breakfast on the dining car but the train was late in getting into Kansas City and we missed our connection for Lawrence. We did not get home until Sunday night.

I thought it might be necessary for you to explain to Lt. Krickhan that due to the early morning train connection out of Kansas City Saturday morning we went up Friday night, and due to the late connection we were late in getting home Sunday evening. Train connections are always uncertain.
