Dear Mr. Bayles:

I desire to call to your attention again the necessity of maintaining sanitary conditions in the swimming pool and in the basement of the gymnasium.

Hallie Harris continues to take Ryland Jackson, the janitor, out of the gymnasium on other duties, and he cannot devote his full time to the care of the pool. Dr. Treese advises that the swimming pool should be vacuum-cleaned at least twice a week. This is a two or three hour job, and should be done after the water has had a chance to be undisturbed for a few hours. The only time we have to suggest for doing this job is very early in the morning, before classes start, and also Sunday morning.

The pool is in use from 8:30 in the morning until 6:30 in the evening - and until 9 o'clock on Tuesday and Thursday evenings. The pool is in use all day Saturday, and on Sunday afternoons from 2 to 6 p.m. This is an extremely heavy load, and I am sure you can understand why it would be necessary to vacuum it at least twice a week. The new hair and lint catchers that were recently installed have to be cleaned twice a day, and each time they are completely filled with debris from the water.

We have as many persons using the gym this summer as we had last fall. By noon each day the basement floor is actually muddy from the dirt carried in on shoes. This is very unsightly as well as unsanitary, and it would improve matters a great deal if the janitor would flush this out and mop the floor every day at noon.

I will appreciate your cooperation in these matters.
