Dear Mrs. Ingells:

I thought a note might explain more clearly to you why we need ice in the drinking fountain at the west end of the gymnasium every day. The iceman has apparently been trying to crowd 50 pounds of ice in the cooler and expecting it to last two days. The large pieces of ice force the lid up, and when that hot afternoon sun gets around to the west door the ice soon melts and the water is very warm.

It is very important that we have cool drinking water for these boys taking physical conditioning because we work them strenuously. The drinking fountain is used from 7 o'clock in the morning until after 6:30 in the evening, and then of course when intramural games are on the boys use it until nearly 11 o'clock at night.

I will appreciate anything you can do to see that it is iced at least once a day, instead of every other day.
