Dear Mr. Bayles:

Confirming our phone conversation with you this morning, Mr. Eberhart and Mr. Brown called me down to the swimming pool to show me the dangerous condition of the pipes and railing in the pool. The pipes have rusted so badly that they present a hazard to the students should one of them break.

Since we have both men and women using our pool in great numbers it would be very unfortunate indeed for one of the students to be injured by any faulty equipment. Therefore, I am suggesting that a careful inspection be made toward the view of eradicating any faulty material that might prove injurious to one of the students.

Certainly if this replacement can not be made this year, it should be one of the "must" jobs next year because the erosion and decay of these pipes under the present conditions will be progressively rapid.
