Dear Mr. Bayles:

Last Monday after the softball games while standing on the intramural field I noticed that there are several large gullies that have been washed out on the banks of the intramural field. The water cuts into the bank badly, as some of these gullies are nearly three feet wide. This condition, of course, will keep on increasing every time it rains unless it can be repaired very soon.

There is another matter to which I wish to call your attention. There is a large tree in direct line with the southeast corner of the gymnasium that overhangs the roadway back of the gymnasium. The branches are so low that they scrape the tops of the cars driving along there, and when it rains, particularly, the branches interfere with the view. I wonder if some of these limbs could be trimmed off.
