Dear Dr. Allen:

The 40' x 14' net in the 3/4-inch mesh, hung all around on a 3/16" Manila Rope, will cost you \$22.25 f.o.b.

Kansas City.

We are attaching a small sample of the weight netting on which we are bidding.

Attached is a golf practice net price list as furnished us and if you find anything on this list that might serve your purpose, the prices quoted are subject to a discount of 33-1/3%. This discount applies on the ones on this sheet -- the price that we quoted on the special 40' net is a net price.

You will notice that targets for these golf nets list at \$24.80 onthe sheet attached; however, it is our suggestion that you purchase an archery target face in the large size, as described on Page 107 of the Lowe & Campbell catalog. The #R187 Extra Face in the 48" size will cost only \$1.05. A target face of this kind is made in such a way that it fits around the straw target, but the edge which has a cord thru it can be cut off very easily; then you can sew it to the net backing. This target face is just an idea and if such a face would serve the purpose, one could be purchased at a very low price.

(The Ever-up rubber tees of the type mentioned to you on the phone are in our stock at 25¢ each.


GOLF PRACTICE NETS

SQUARED MESH

LIKE IN TENNIS NETS

Some people prefer squared mesh in golf nets as it hangs a little straighter than diamond mesh and is in some cases neater in appearance. It is a little more expensive, however, and has the disadvantage that it may be more easily broken because it is more rigid and does not "give" as much as the diamond mesh when struck by a ball.

It can be supplied in all the regular sizes of mesh and twine.



CANVAS BACKS FOR GOLF NETS

For safety these backs should be made of very heavy duck and we wish to warn our customers against using some of the cheap canvases sold by some concerns. A ball driven through a canvas might cause serious damage. We recommend that the back be made of No. 6 duck and in the shape of a shallow box as shown in the illustration. We supply these box-like backs unless otherwise specified. Grommets are placed along the edges 3 in. apart to permit lacing the net to the canvas. The end of the net should set INSIDE the edge of the canvas.

TARGETS FOR GOLF NETS

These are squares of No. 4 duck, 6 x 6 ft., with a bull's-eye painted in the center. They provide protection to the back canvas as well as something to shoot at.


