- 1. College Juniors and Seniors who wish to secure the three-year Renewable-for-Life Certificate will begin with P50 and A50; then elect any two of the following three courses: H64, S52 and E50. This will constitute the Fundamentals group. After completing the Fundamentals group, they will elect three additional hours in Education and will take the Methods course in their major subject. The State Board now requires Supervised Teaching except in the cases of those persons who have had three or more years of satisfactory teaching experience. College students are warned to elect only those Education courses for which the College gives credit.
- 2. Students in the School of Education will begin their professional work with P50, A50 and four hours selected from H64, S52 and E50 unless they have advanced Education credit from other schools. In any case, they will consult the Education Adviser before making elections. For further details students will consult pages 78-84 of the Part I of the University catalogue.
- 3. Graduate students with a major in Education will in every case arrange their course with the representative of the department of Education.

Note: All courses numbered from 300 to 399 inclusive carry credit in the Graduate School only.
