161. THE UPPER EXTREMITY. Two hours credit. 80 hours. Fee, \$5. 8:00-12:00 and 1:30-4:30. Tracy.

163. THE ABDOMEN AND THORAX. Three hours credit. 112 hours. Fee, \$10. 8:00-12:00 and 1:30-4:30. Tracy.
