## MEDICINE

72. PHYSICAL DIAGNOSIS. Two hours credit. Lectures and recitations. By appointment. Hashinger.

82. PHYSICAL DIAGNOSIS. Three hours credit. Entire class meets daily in the dispensary, where instruction is given in physical diagnosis, the student taking case histories and making the examinations under supervision. By appointment. Hashinger, Delp.

92. MEDICAL CLINICAL COURSE. Three hours credit. The entire class meets daily for clinical ward rounds and group demonstration of therapeutic procedures. Students are assigned to patients. Major and staff.

283. CLINICAL PATHOLOGY. Two hours credit. Students are trained in the technique of examining sputa, gastric contents, urine, feces, puncture fluids, and blood. By appointment. Weber.

## NEUROLOGY

92. PSYCHIATRY—PRACTICAL WORK. One hour credit. In the out-patient department and wards. Students are assigned to instructors in the clinic where they assist in history taking and the examination of patients. Gibson and staff.

## OBSTETRICS

71. PHYSIOLOGICAL OBSTETRICS. Two hours credit. Lectures and recitations. By appointment. Calkins.

81c. CLINICS IN OBSTETRICS. No credit. Demonstrations of parturitions in the hospital. By appointment. Calkins.

## PATHOLOGY

271. GENERAL PATHOLOGY. Eight hours credit. Gross morbid anatomy and pathological histology and immunology, including practical work in autopsy and histologic technique. By appointment. Walker.

282. SPECIAL PATHOLOGY—AUTOPSY TECHNIQUE. Two hours credit. Performance of autopsies by individual students under supervision, with class discussion of findings as correlated with the clinical histories. Special emphasis is placed upon the gross morbid changes, the disturbances of function and the fundamental chemical processes underlying the pathologic processes under discussion. By appointment. Walker.

92. PEDIATRICS. One hour credit. Neff and staff.

(a). WARD ROUNDS AND CLERKSHIP. Ward rounds, practical work in pediatric dietaries, pediatric technic, examination of the newly born. Records required. Immunization, contagious diseases in isolation department of Kansas City General Hospital.
