Gary Thompson, their clever little guard, exploded the heaviest one-game shot of any tournament entry in that one with 40 points.

K-State has played in slightly rougher going to reach at its 3-3 level. Its lost to Indiana's highly-ranked Hoosiers, 72-96, to Drake, 64-70... the Bulldegs lost only by three to Indiana... and to Houston, 79-86. The latter effort must be considered a good one since it was played in Houston. Both other k defeats also were on the road.

Some idea of why this is considered the best firstround match on the card can be found in the teams' comparative conquests
of Texas Tech. The Wildcats beat the Raiders, 19 points (89-70) in

Manhattan. The Cyclones clubbed them, 18, (70-52) at Ames.

Thompson isxthex comes in thirdranked on the pretourney scoring tables at with a 23.2 average. He trails only Missouri's
Norm Stewart. K-State will present the meet's highest -scoring sophomere
to date in Jack Parr, their 6-9 rookie center. He is travelling at 16.3,
fifth on the individual tabulations.

If The Wildcats can get by their operner they have a better than even chance of reaching the finals against the Colorado-Oklahoma winner.

Cornell, is capable of upsetting Kansas in the final game of the lower bracket Wednesday. The Big Red will present a 6-4, first 6-5, 6-4 front line, hubbed by 220-pound center Ray Zelek, and is starting four seniors. Like Iowa State, kingyxtx the Nawx I thacans will present an indevidual defensive problem in Chuck Rolles, 5-6 guard, who is averaging 23.0 through their first five pre-tournament games. He fired a 37-point salvo in the fir 82-63 demolition of Brown last week. Thavking Cornell stands 3-2 having lost, 50-55, to Washington in St. Louis Friday.
