

TIGERS COAST IN

Norm Stewart Hits 30 Points in
81 to 57 Victory Over
Idaho.

NO THREAT BY THE VANDALS.

Missouri Takes Command After
Six Minutes and Stays on
Top Thereafter.

Columbia, Mo., Dec. 19.

—Norman Stewart scored thirty points to lead the University of Missouri to an 81 to 57 victory over the University of Idaho here tonight.

The Tigers shook out of a 5-5 tie before the game was six minutes old, and were in absolute command thereafter. Late in the first period the Pacific Coast conference team closed to within six points of the free-scoring Missourians, but by intermission time the Tigers had widened the advantage to 42-27, and they raced away to a 30-point lead early in the second period and kept an advantage of about that proportion most of the way.

Coach Wilbur Stalcup found the secondary scoring he has been looking for to back up Stewart's regular barrage. Bill Ross made sixteen, Redford Reichert twelve and Lionel Smith ten, despite the fact that the regulars gave away a good deal of time to the reserves.

Jay Buhler was the high scorer for the vandals with twenty-two points.

Tonight's game was the last for the Tigers before the Kansas City tournament which starts December 27. Stalcup dismissed the M. U. squad tonight, and the fifteen men chosen for the tournament trip will return Thursday to resume practice.

The Idaho squad will continue its Mid-West campaign against Washington university at St. Louis Wednesday night.
