Cornell Blows a Big Lead as Huskers and K-State Take Consolation Games.

WILDCATS WIN IN A ROMP

Oklahoma Falls, 86-64, While Guest Team Bows, 70-69, in Afternoon Play.

Nebraska's Cornhuskers overcame a 15-point deficit to take a 70-69 thriller from guest Cornell yesterday afternoon in the consolation bracket of the Big Seven pre-season basketball tournament.

Kansas State had a far easier time getting by Oklahoma, leading by twenty-four points late in the second half and emerging with a final 86-64 victory.

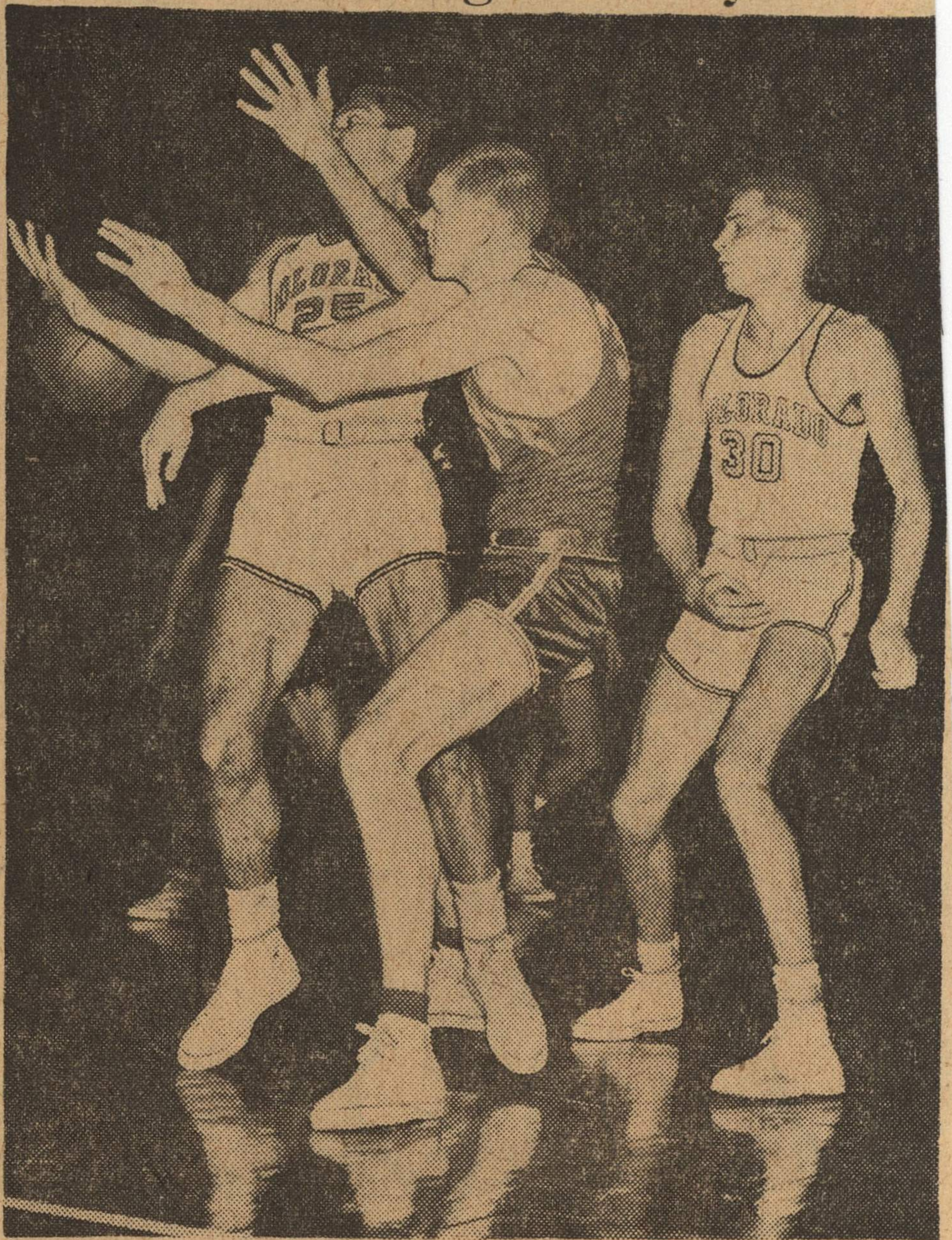
Rolles, Roberson Star.

About 4,000 persons sat in for the matinee double header in the Municipal Auditorium.

Paced by 5-6 Chuck Rolles and Irvin Roberson, who hit thirty and twenty-two points respectively, the Big Red from Ithaca, N. Y., surged rapidly to the front to lead 20-9 halfway through the first period. Things got worse before they got better. The Cornell lead grew to 28-13 and 32-17 before the halftime gun which saw the New Yorkers enjoying a 40-27 advantage.

But the Huskers began hitting in the second half, enough to raise their average from a cool 34.2 percentage in the first half to a game average of 40.9.
