## Rice Registers 62-47 Victory Over Sooners

HOUSTON, Dec. 8-Rice Institute's fancy-stepping Owls dragged Oklahoma's Sooners down out of the cage clouds here Thursday night, breaking open a tight tussle late in the first half and coasting in, 62-47, to snap the visitor's one-

game "winning streak."

At least partially shattered as Rice traipsed to its fourth victory without defeat this season were hopes that coach Doyle Parrack might work a miracle in his first year with the thin OU squad. The Sooners surprised Baylor last weekend but this time went down firing despite a 23-point salvo by hard-working center Le-Roy Bacher.

Bacher was the night's most proific scorer although many of his coft shots from in close refused to drop before intermission. Pocketsized guard Jimmy Peck had hoop trouble, too, and settled for six points after missing several drives

at the hoop.

Inability to hit free throws doomed OU to defeat, the Sooners downing only one of seven in the second half to miss a chance for a dozen more points under the one-and-one rule. Free Throws Decisive

The Parracks threw a tight picket line around Rice's touted 3-10 sophomore pivotman, Temple Cucker, and limited him to 10 oints. But they couldn't tame the est of the free-shooting owls, tho won going away as Joe Durenburger posted 20 points, Fred Voods 16 and Tucker and Dale all 10 each. The Owls put up 70 shots, hit-

ng only 21 for 30 percent while ne Sooners had a 33 percent nooting night on 19 of 57. But ice drilled in 20 of 25 charity osses while OU got down only nine of 18.

The Sooners led only once, at 0-9 after seven minutes of play. 3ut they stayed close until 2:10 efore halftime when ball netted he first of four points that lifted Rice into a 34-28 lead at internission.
