Dobbs' final point, coming on a free toss, and John Parker's set shot six seconds ahead of the gun wrapped it up for the Kansans.

The Badgers couldn't cope with Dobbs at all. The slender senior was hitting his favorite jump shot from the top of the circle and, when Wisconsin moved out to stop that, he drove down for layups.

Johnson, only 6-6, held Wisconsin's starting center without a field goal and patrolled both

backboards effectively. However, reserve center Dan Folz did pick up four baskets for the losers in one of those belated rallies.

Miller, who now has scored 57 points in three games, was largely responsible for Wisconsin's improvement in the second half, getting 15 of his 24 points after intermission.

By winning here Saturday, Kansas boosted its overall record against Big Ten teams to five wins and six losses. The Jayhawks started getting even in their opener this year by trouncing Northwestern, 91-70. KU had to go all out Wednesday night to subdue Wichita, 56-55.

Wisconsin had beaten Notre Dame but had lost to Butler of Indiana.
