their opener they have a better than even chance of reaching the finals against the Colorado-Oklahoma winner.

Cornell, this year's guest team, is capable of upsetting Kansas in the final game of the lower bracket Wednesday. The Big Red will present a 6-4, 6-5, 6-4 front line, hubbed by 220-pound center Ray Zelek, and is starting four seniors.

Like Iowa State, the Ithacans will present an individual defensive problem in Chuck Rolles, 5-6 guard, who is averaging 23.0 through their five pre-tournament games. He fired a 37-point salvo in the 82-63 demolition of Brown last week. Cornell stands 3-2.

Kansas has been playing in a stiffer league, having split two games with SMU's defending Southwest champions, while beating Northwestern, Wichita, and Wisconsin and losing a nine-pointer to towering Rice at Houston.

Missouri, shooting for its second tournament crown in succession, something no team has yet accomplished, tackles Nebraska in Wednesday's 7:30 p.m. opener.
