Peck topped boards with a 57-46 advantage as Charley Harrison, 6-6 center, and Bobby Thym, 6-1 forward, grabbed 17 and 15 rebounds respectively. King was high for the Sooners with 13, while Abbey and Bacher, the other two men on OU's front line, gathered in but six and five against the vicious ballhawks of Vandy.

> For nine minutes in the second half before the Commodores broke away the score teetered between Vandy leads of 5 to 9 ponts. The Sooners couldn't pare the margin to less than five, although at least four times they went down with the ball while trailing by five. Each time a wild shot or mechanical error would spoil the bid.

Bacher Fouls

A crucial play occurred to start the Vanderbilt surge. Behind 58-53 the Sooners swept down and Bacher sped under the goal but was in no position to shoot. He passed off to King, who had a close shot, but Bacher fouled Thym in the process.

Thym converted two free throws and Vandy led by seven rather than Oklahoma moving within

three points of a tie.

That was the spark Vandy needed and from then on the Com modores set sail for their fourth straight triumph.
