Iowa State, in the title round for the first time since 1948, will play Oklahoma for third, starting at 8 o'clock tonight. The Cyclones finished sixth last year.

It was a game as far along as 42-39, when that second cold spell set in for the Cyclones, but the Wildcats uncorked eight successive points to open an 11-point lead and kept a comfortable margin thereafter.

There was a stretch of 7 minutes in the first half when Iowa State hadn't scored from the field. The last one lasted 5 minutes.

By the time that Gary Thompson broke it with a fast break bucket, the only three-time winner of this tournament was safely ahead, 54-42.

Cyclone center Chuck Duncan, 6-5, toiled mightily again and wound up with 23 points—but it didn't match the 16 by sub center Jung, plus the 10 by regular center, 6-7 Roger Craft.

Worse, there was nothing Coach Bill Strannigan's scrappy team, which upset Kansas Tuesday night, could do against the type of rebounding Kansas State had on tap.

Duncan kept up in spurts. So did 6-4 forward Don DeKoster,
