U. twice, at Boulder, 88-66, and 65-46, an aggregate of forty-one points. The Bears whipped Oregon State, 52-50, and Oregon, 64-52, both on the road. The Beavers did not have Swede Halbrook, their 7-3 center who won't be eligible until the semester.
