Edge on Free Throws.

It see-sawed for a few points, then the Jayhawks slowly pulled ahead to a 42-39 halftime lead. Free throwing maintained this margin for eight minutes of the third quarter when Kansas was goalless.

Patterson, an amazing rebounder at 6-3, broke this drought with his first field goal—then promptly turned around and gave the Sooners one by touching the rim on a missed long shot.

Patterson wound up with 12 points, Kelley had 17 and Born 13. This kind of firing was too much for Oklahoma which had only Lane, Ron Blue (12) and Sterling Jones (11) scoring well.

There were no less than 105 free throws in the game, Kansas making 36 and missing 19 to Oklahoma's 33 of 50.

It was Kansas' fourth victory in six starts and it maintained a four-year grasp on this title by teams from the sunflower state. Oklahoma's loss was its fourth in seven games.
