the latter was accomplished in tuesday's 86-70

semifinal massacre of nebraska, which had tumbled kansas state's defending champions only the night before. ou buried washington, this year's guest team, 87-77, in monday's opening round. the old single-game mark was 83 points in the one-basket victory over colorado at boulder last year.

it isn't likely the sooners will enjoy such point harvests against kansas. the jayhawkers will be the best defensive club, next to oklahoma a & m, oklahoma has next to date. they have much more floor speed than nebraska and the big man, in 6-9 b.h. born. the latter has scored only 29 points in two starts here, but poses the major problem for ou nonetheless. sooner center bob waller must spot him three inches.

waller because of his speed down-court and outside shooting ability, in turn, certainly will be ku's no. 1 problem. he can beat born on the break and pull him away from the goal on defense. meanwhile, the jayhawkers' new passel of sophomores which coach phog allen is employing without hesitation will be getting their first bewildering look at the drake shuffle.

as for oklahoma's thrashing of nebraska, it was a fantastic second-half rout. trailing, 34-40 at intermission, the drakes sped repeatedly on the break to demolish the huskers, 32-11, in the third period.

guard lester lane led the charge by collecting 13 of his 20 points during this stanza. waller kept the flame lit through the anti-climatic fourth period with 10 of his 33 points. the latter figure is the meet's individual single-game
