

With anything approaching their early pace, ~~one~~ of ~~the~~ any one of the four must be conceded a chance ~~to~~ at the tournament scoring ~~per~~mant. Van Cleave will come in tied for second on the conference pre-tournament scoring tables with a 17.7 average in four games. Segar is fourth with 15.9 in six; Stauffer fifth with 15.6 in five, and Lane sixth with 15.3 in four.
