Dear Mike:

I will be glad to look at young Mr. Peterka most any Tuesday or Thursday morning. If I can be informed a couple of days ahead of Peterka's coming I will make arrangements to see him. It will be a pleasure for me to advise treatment after I have examined his arm.

The baseball arm is a lot more difficult than the sacro iliac to treat because a fellow walks on his leg and the strain in the sacro iliac shows up much more readily. If we could start some of these fellows walking on their hands, then it would be easier to diagnose the trouble, but it is really much more difficult to treat a pitching arm than it is a bad knee or a bad leg.

But you let Mr. Peterka come on. Have him let me know ahead of time when he is coming. And after all your build up, I assure you I cannot afford to let him down. I will then advise his friendly councillor, this guy Ahearn, who is trying to beat both Kansas and Missouri, whether he will be able to eat any meals after I have treated him.
