

overall norton canned 65 points to rank fourth among the tourney's individual pointsmiths. only clyde lovellette's 76; jim ramstead's 68, and jim buchanan's 67, surpassed him.

tournament champion kansas placed two men, lovellette, and forward bob kenney, on the first all-star club. theyvuxvx jvixatvx bill stauffer, missouri's great-backboarder; dick knostgan, of kansas state, and j buchanan, completed this lineup.

honorabile mention spots went to dean kelley, and jim iverson kansas; bob rousey, kansas state; art bunte, colorado; jim stange and george hess, iowa state; gene landolt, missouri, and sebron tucker, stanford.

tournament notes: ku's clyde lovellette had to wait until the final session to embrace his third consecutive tournament individual point crown..... he closed with a 26-point burst against missouri to top the leaders with 76, eight below his all-time meet record.... he thus ran his aggregate for nine gamesx tourney games to 222, anvavvavgavx a municipal auditorium average of 24.6 25x4.... missouri presented the tournament's two best freshmen, win wilfong, who nailed 17 points in the finals against kansas, and art helms, a 6-4 forward but other yearlings like art bunte, blubbery 220-pound colorado center; bill heitholt, kansas; jim smith, kansas state, also caught the eye..... xxx railbirds who went into the tournament with the idea that the 1952 big seven race would be top-heavy with kansas and kansas state, came away conceding missouri a title chance, and tabbing oklahoma and iowa state as certain spoilers.
