(jess) prisock is one of the best. in another year, nobody'll
stop him. and they're all a great bunch of guys. I enjoyed playing

mmanhumbhim them."

as he tore tape off his injured hand. "we should have beaten 'em a lot worse. we gave 'em too much. but they're easily the best ball club we've seen all year. they've got a fine bunch of boys."

"just say we're just like casey -- only we came back and really hit a homer."

and don't blame phog for being happy. after all, it was his his 691st victory since he started coaching back in 1908. and, by his own admission, it was one of the greatest...
