Dear Ned:

I have been out of town, and upon my return I find your letter awaiting me. I checked with the railroad company here and the fare to New York from here is \$71.50 and the pullman is \$10.25 each way, \$20.50 round trip, making a total of \$92.00 per person. For fifteen men that would make a total of \$1380.00.

I agree with your reckoning of \$100.00 a day for the party for hotel and meals.

The best possible time that we could make out of Lawrence would be to leave on Sunday, arriving in New York Monday night, playing Tuesday; then with a day of rest on Wednesday, playing at Philadelphia on Thursday, and getting out of Philadelphia for Lawrence - all this would make a minimum of seven days by the closest rail connection we could make. That would add \$100.00 additional. This \$700.00 added to \$1380.00 would make \$2080.00, instead of the amount of \$1850.00 that you mentioned.

Any way that Fordham and Temple desire to split the expenses is entirely agreeable to me and I will go along with those figures. So that I can present this to the Athletic Board at the proper time, will you again give me the percentage figures on both halls that you gave me when we were talking in Kansas City?
