
The trip was contemplated as an educational venture as well as an athletic contest and incidentally, the thought of making a handsome net profit was also seriously considered.

It was necessary to stop in Chicago overnight enroute to the East to make better chair car connections. Then the trip through Canada, giving the boys the experience of traveling on foreign soil, the wonders of Niagara, the exaultation of the United States Military Academy at West Point, the Liberty Bell at Independence Hall, Washington, D.C., with the F.B.I. Building was stimulating. And then the experiences of New York, Radio City, and other Washington, D.C. tours, etc. made an educational tour that perhaps was worth the trip from an educational standpoint.

The team will leave Lawrence, Kansas on the Santa Fe Streamliner at 1:00 P.M., arriving in Chicago at 9:30 P.M. They will stay at the Allerton Hotel while in Chicago, leaving Chicago next morning at 9:15 A.M. for Ann Arbor, Michigan, arriving there at 2:23 P.M.

The Kansas team will work out in the Michigan Field House and stay in Ann Arbor at the Michigan Union, leaving Ann Arbor at 7:01 A.M., December 25. They will arrive at Niagara Falls at 1:27 P.M., leaving Niagara Falls at 8:30 P.M. and arriving at Buffalo at 9:30 P.M. Christmas night.

The team will leave Buffalo, on pullman, at 9:54 P.M. Christmas night and arrive at West Point, New York, U.S.Military Academy, at 9:20 A.M. the boys will work out at the Academy Field House, leaving West Point later in the afternoon to arrive in New York in time to take their luggage to the Hotel Piccadilly, where they will stay during the time they are in New York. They will then go to Madison Square Garden and work out between halves of the Illinois-Manhattan College game. Santa Clara, California and City College of New York also play the same night.

On December 31 the team will go to Washington, D.C., where they will spend the day visiting the F.B.I. Building in Washington, as well as the trip to Mount Vernon, etc.
