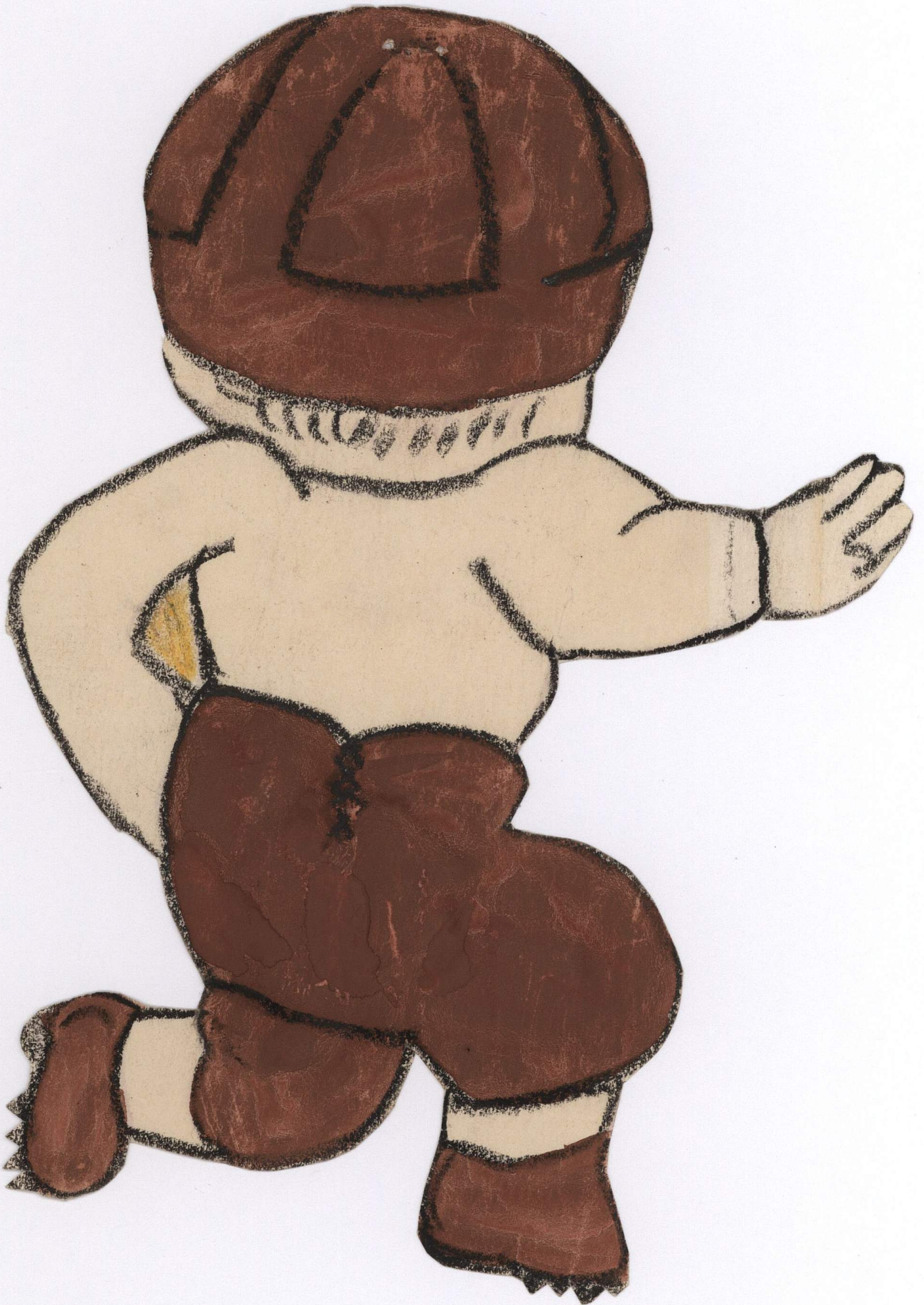

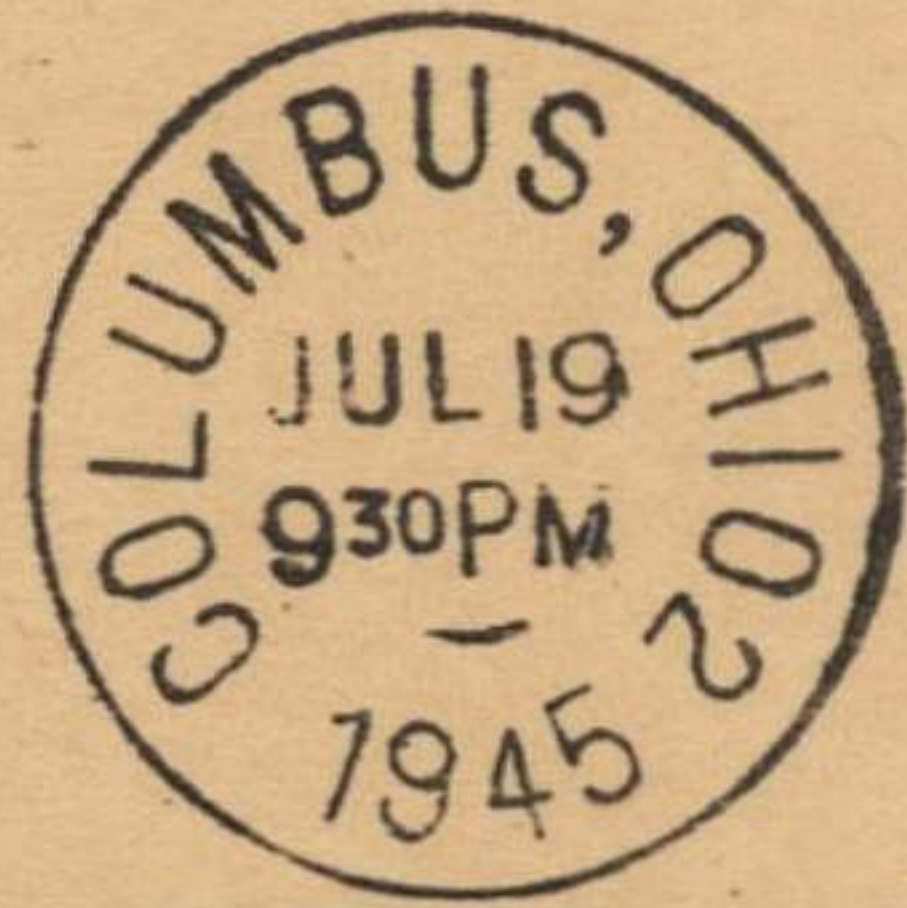


We are expecting you in Beattie,


