We are most happy that you are coming.

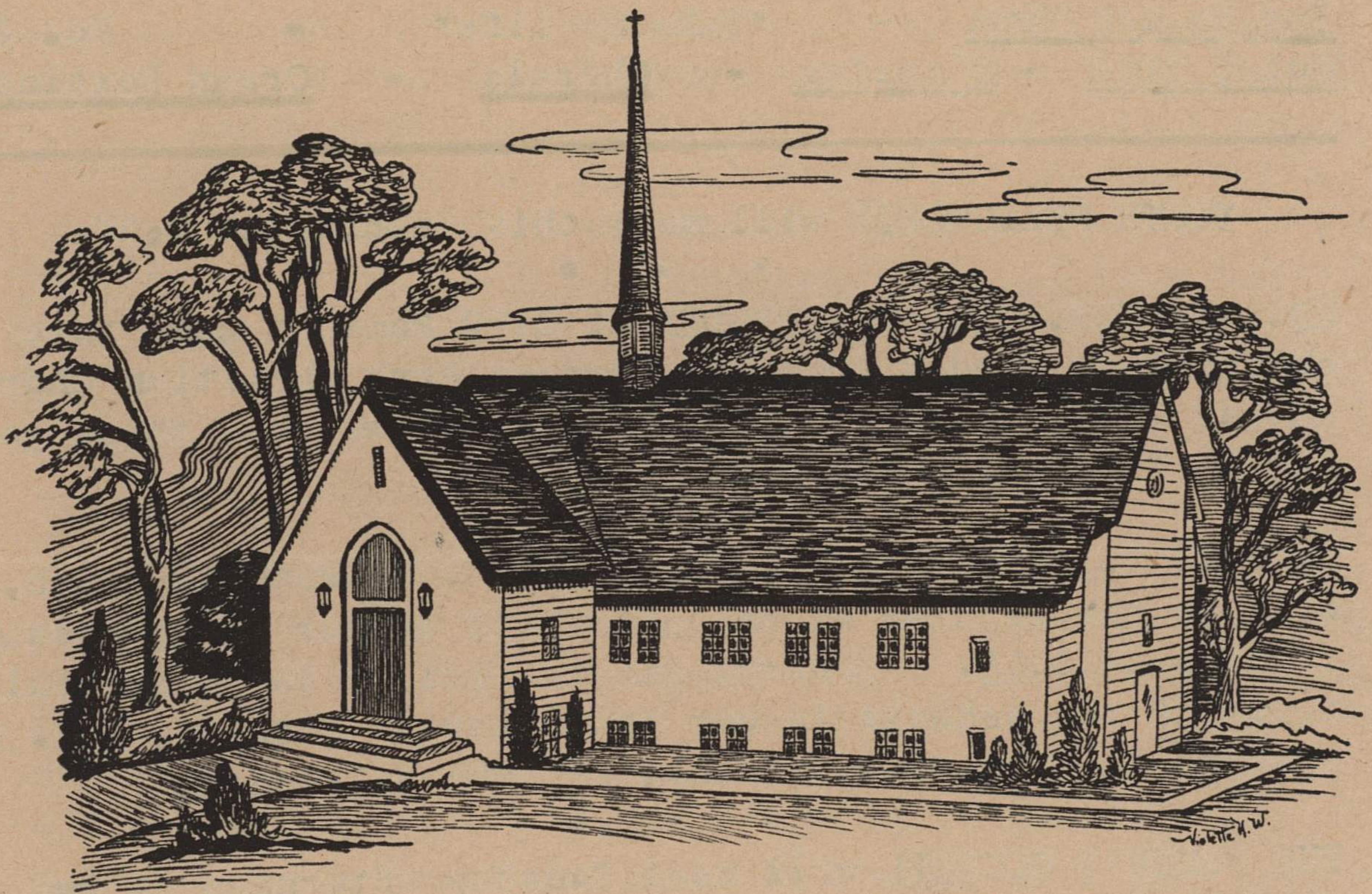
