

EXCERPT FROM THE KANSAS SESSION LAWS OF 1945:

CHAPTER 173

RECORDS OF MILITARY SERVICE; FREE RECORDING THEREOF  
BY REGISTER OF DEEDS; FREE COPIES

House Bill No. 129

AN ACT relating to the free recording in the office of register of deeds of records of military service and providing for the furnishing of certified copies of such records without charge.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF KANSAS:

SECTION 1. Whenever there shall be presented to the register of deeds of any county in this state the discharge or other official records of military service of any person who has been honorably discharged from the armed forces of the United States at any time, said register of deeds shall record the same in a record book which shall be provided for such purpose and no fee shall be charged for such recordation. Upon request, of the person to whom such discharge was issued, his agent or relative, the register of deeds shall prepare and furnish certified copies of any such discharge or records of military service and no fee shall be charged for the first five copies therefor.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the official state paper.
