Dear Mr. Applegate:

Last Friday evening at 7:30 Rev. Allison, our pastor at the First Methodist Church, asked a number of stewards and board members to meet to discuss the indebtedness caused by the remodeling of the church kitchen. The plan was to distribute the names of our church members among 35 of the men, giving each man about ten cards.

Some members have already given, but others have perhaps not had an opportunity to subscribe. The amount of money to be raised to liquidate the indebtedness is \$1336.73. I have seen all the other members and am writing you this letter with the hope that you can inform Mr. Howard L. Sutherland, the captain of our team, as to the amount you might wish to give. Perhaps you would like a suggestion as to the amount some of the others are giving. Some of the larger donations were \$25.00, while the average gift was about \$5.00, but some give \$2 and \$3.

It is not necessary to pay the amount now. All we would like to know is the amount you might wish to pledge, and you can pay it at the church office any afternoon of the week, or Sunday morning during the church hour the office is open. We are to be ready to report on each card on Sunday, June 18. I know how busy you are, and if you will just call Mr. Howard Sutherland at 1521W, I will appreciate your kindly cooperation. Even though you might be unable to give, I will appreciate it if you will notify Mr. Sutherland, but we trust that you will help us.
