# Tulsa Faces Stiff Tests

TULSA university's co-leadership in the Missouri Valley basketball race undergoes a rigid testing this week as the Golden Hurricane meets two conference foes on the road—Houston Monday and Oklahoma A&M Saturday.

Currently tied with St. Louis for the loop lead at 2-0, Tulsa would move into a commanding spot if it were to win twice this week. Following these games the Hurricane faces only Detroit and St. Louis away from home, while the Billikens still must visit every port in the circuit.

However, Tulsa's chances of sweeping the next two games appear rather slim. Houston is unbeaten at home this season and the Oklahoma Aggies looked potent while lacing Wichita in their

last conference outing nearly two weeks ago.

A&M follows Tulsa into Houston for a Wednesday night game, and two victories this week for the defending champion Cowpunchers would move them into the position of logical challenger to St. Louis.

Those three games involving Oklahoma's members of the Valley account for all the conference activity this week. However, members of the far-flung circuit will engage in five non-league games while seeking to improve on their gaudy 46-16 record against outsiders.

Wichita, all but knocked out of the title picture in Saturday night's 73-71 loss at St. Louis, meets Drake at Des Moines Monday night and takes on Wyoming at Hutchinson, Kan., Saturday.

PICKED to win the crown in a pre-season poll of coaches, the Shockers now have dropped three of their four Valley starts.

Other non-conference business Saturday finds Houston hosting Texas, Detroit meeting cross-town rival Wayne and St. Louis entertaining St. John's of Brooklyn in the Billikens' homecoming scrap.

St. Louis again proved the old adage that there is so little difference between winning and losing when the Bills nipped Wichita on Jim McLaughlin's jump shot in the final second. St. Louis' other conference victory came by one point over Houston on Dick Boushka's basket with 12 seconds remaining in an overtime period.

Wichita, on the other hand, has lost two of its three games in the dying seconds. In addition to the narrow setback at St. Louis the Wheatshockers were beaten by Tulsa, 67-65, on Bob Patterson's goal with seven seconds remaining.

Action in the Big Seven comes to a virtual halt this

week as schools wind up mid-year examinations. Only game slated in that loop matches leading Colorado against Iowa State at Boulder Monday night. The Buffs took over first place last week when Missouri dropped a home contest to Kansas State, 78-67.

Big Seven teams are meeting more success on the road this year than they have in ages. Of the 15 league games played to date visiting quintets have won seven while losing eight.

Colorado, Missouri and Kansas State each has won twice on the road already with the conference race barely a third completed.

In the Valley visiting clubs have won three of the nine games and barely lost three others when home forces snatched victory in the waning moments.

# Tulsa Bidding for Valley Crown

**A** NEW championship contender appeared on the Missouri Valley basketball horizon this week following Tulsa's surge to the top of the standings with its 67-65 victory at Wichita Saturday night.

The Golden Hurricane, led by its sizzling Bob Patterson, now owns a 2-0 league record and the triumph at Wichita could prove all-important as the season unfolds since road victories are hard to come by in this rugged circuit.

St. Louis (1-0) still is a good bet to succeed the Oklahoma Aggies in the throne room and can draw even with Tulsa if the Bil-

likens win at home against Wichita Saturday night.

This is the only conference game of the week for Valley quintets and it's a "must" affair for the Shockers, who were tabbed by loop coaches as favorites in a pre-season poll.

Wichita was victim of a one-two Iba punch the past week as the Shockers were trimmed by Hank Iba's Oklahoma Aggies at Stillwater Tuesday night, then nipped by brother Clarence's Hurricane Saturday as Patterson sank a fieldgoal with seven seconds remaining to crack a 65-all tie.

The winning basket gave Patterson 36 points for the game and left him with a 32-point conference average, highest of any individual in the midlands' two major circuits—the Valley and Big Seven.

Missouri and Colorado both added to their stature in the Big Seven the past week by winning on the road against Kansas' opposition. The Tigers (3-0) thumped Kansas State, 94-85, at Manhattan Saturday night after Colorado (2-0) turned in a 65-54 victory over Kansas at Lawrence earlier in the week.

**L**OOMING big in Missouri's favor are triumphs at both Kansas and Kansas State and a home conquest over Nebraska, which currently appears as the circuit's next strongest entry following the co-leaders.

The Huskers polished off both Kansas quintets last week to move into third place with a 3-1 record. The Jayhawks, in losing 66-62 at Nebraska Saturday night, remained locked in the Big Seven cellar with Oklahoma, which was flattened 105-76 at Iowa State despite a 38-point Armory scoring record by the Sooners' Lester Lane.

Oklahoma and Kansas continue weekend road trips Monday night and barring an upset the last place deadlock will continue. The Sooners play at Colorado and Kansas at Iowa State.

Only two other conference games are slated for Big Seven teams this week, both involving Kansas State. The Wildcats go to Missouri Wednesday night and entertain Iowa State Saturday. Nebraska is host to Maryville, Mo., Teachers Friday in the week's only non-league contest.

**T**HERE is even less activity in the Valley this week as semester examinations curtail schedules. In addition to the crucial Wichita-St. Louis scrap on Saturday, the Valley card is limited to a pair of Thursday games against outside foes.

On that night Tulsa awaits Oklahoma City U for the rubber match of the series between the Oklahoma rivals and Wichita takes on touring Seattle which moves on to Oklahoma City Saturday night.

Three new school scoring marks were broken during the week as scores continue to soar on the strength of the new bonus free throw rule. Iowa State hung up a record of 105 points at the expense of the Sooners, Houston hit a new high in downing Texas A&M, 107-66, Saturday night and St. Louis reached an all-time crest in flogging Drake, 102-82.

The Billikens, rolling in high now after absorbing their lumps through a rugged early-season slate, came back Saturday night to batter Bradley, 98-75.

Valley quintets swept six games against outsiders the past week to run their record to a gaudy 44-16 in non-conference play this season. Detroit, 2-2 in

the Valley, is unbeaten in 10 games outside the fold.

While Patterson is staking an early claim to the Valley scoring title, Chuck Duncan of Iowa State moved to the top of the Big Seven tables with a 29-point average for three games. Duncan tabbed 36 points against Oklahoma Saturday night despite sitting out eight minutes of the second half.

Actually, Duncan cracked the Armory scoring record before he was withdrawn, then watched from the bench as Lane eclipsed his brand new mark with a 38-point effort.

The little Sooner speedster, No. 2 in the Big Seven scoring derby with a 26-point clip, pushed his career total to 1,011 points to become the first University of Oklahoma cager in history to reach the 1,000 level.
