## University of Kansas 1946 Summer Session

## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS AND REGISTRATION

(Revised 21 May 1946)

Details regarding admission to the several schools of the University are to be found in Part I of the University Catalog, "General Information." Copies of this catalog may be secured by writing the Registrar, 122 Frank Strong Hall. All questions concerning admission to the University should be addressed to the Registrar.

Students who have been enrolled in the University during the spring semester, 1946, (except those transferring from one school of the University to another at the beginning of the Summer Session) are not required to register for the Summer Session, but may go directly to enrollment after paying their fees. (See below.)

Students admitted to the University of Kansas for the first time, and former students who have not been enrolled during the 1945-'46 school year, must register. Fees will be collected from such students at the time of registration.

Registration will be held at Room 122, Frank Strong Hall, according to the following schedule (the letters refer to the initial letter of the student's last name):

#### FEES

FEES MUST BE PAID BEFORE ENROLLMENT (except private music lesson fees, and organ or piano rental fees, which are payable within four days after enrollment). Students who register will pay their fees during the registration process.

1946 Summer Session students who were registered for the spring semester, 1946, will not be required to register but will call at the Business Office, 123 Frank Strong Hall, according to the letter system for registration of new students (see above) for fee cards and payment of fees.

Veterans of World War II who plan to have their fees paid by the Veterans Administration should make sure that their Certificates of Eligibility and Entitlement (VA Rehabilitation Form 1953) are filed with the Veterans Training Service, Room 2, Frank Strong Hall, prior to the opening of school.

Matriculation Fee. Each student is required to pay a matriculation fee when he first enrolls in the University. The fee is paid but once and is never refunded. For residents of Kansas it is \$10.00; for nonresidents, \$20.00.

Incidental Fee, Regular Summer Session. The full incidental fee is charged every Summer Session student except those permitted to pay fees at an hourly rate under the provisions of the Limited Enrollment, Professional, Graduate Field, or Staff rate plans. For information concerning these hourly rates, consult the Registrar. The schedule showing the rate at which the Incidental Fee is charged for the several schools of the University is as follows:

ACTIVITY FEE. An Activity Fee of \$1.65 is charged every student (at Lawrence), except a person paying the Professional Fee of the Graduate Field Fee or a full-time member of the staff of the University. (State and Federal admission taxes are additional.)

Union Fee. A student union fee of \$2.00 is charged every Summer Session student except full-time staff members and students paying Graduate Field fee or Professional fee.

HEALTH FEE. The health fee is \$3.75 for the eight weeks Summer Session.

LATE FEE. A fee of \$2.50 is collected for enrollment after the beginning of classes.

APPLIED MUSIC FEES. Students enrolled in courses in the School of Fine Arts requiring individual instruction pay additional fees. Students enrolled in such courses for the Summer Session are assessed at the rates indicated below:

Enrollment will follow the procedures of the academic year with College, Education, Fine Arts and Engineering students enrolling in Robinson Gymnasium; Business students at Room 214, Frank Strong Hall; Law students at Room 108, Green Hall; Medical students (Lawrence courses) at Room 104, Haworth Hall; Pharmacy students at Room 211, Bailey Chemical Laboratories; Graduate students at Room 227, Frank Strong Hall.

In the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, class enrollments will be in the main gymnasium, Robinson Gymnasium. Students will enroll in the order determined by the beginning letter of the last name according to the following alphabetical scheme:
