
My dear Dr. Allen:


Dear Phog:

Dear Professor Templin:

This will revise instructions given in my letter of April 27 regarding the F. C. Allen Scholarship Fund.

A late contribution of \$25, plus a contribution from Dr. Allen himself of \$63.21, brings the total amount up to \$750. It is Dr. Allen's desire that this be left to accumulate until it is an even \$1000. This will require twelve years.

Mr. Klooz, University bursar, will turn over to you a check for \$750. It is the desire of the F. C. Allen Scholarship Committee that you buy a United States war bond with this amount and that the Committee on Aids and Awards, with your kind assistance, make plans for starting the execution and administration of the F. C. Allen scholarship or scholarships after the bond has matured to \$1000.

Dear Fred:

I acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 2nd instant.

You mention that the \$750 bond nets only $2\frac{1}{2}\%$ and that it would require twelve years to mature. I didn't know that there was any difference for organizations, foundations, and the like. But even so, twelve years is only two more years and I think it would be better to buy the \$750 bond. I would be willing to make up the difference (\$63.21) if your committee is willing.

Of course, if this is not agreeable with you it is perfectly all right with me. I thought the \$1,000 bond would be better than the other method. However, that is up to your committee.


Dear Phog:

Thanks for your letter of June 25. Since writing our letter which you got, the fund has received another \$25 contribution so the total amount is actually \$686.79, leaving only \$63.21 short of the \$750 goal.

I wonder if you are right about \$750 running up to \$1000 in ten years. My experience in war bonds has been that organizations, foundations, and the like can buy only series F and G. They net $2\frac{1}{2}\%$ which would require twelve years to mature \$750 into \$1000.

Gentlemen and Friends:

I take this means of thanking you sincerely for your generous efforts in showing me this exceptional courtesy and honor. I note that you placed in the care of Professor Olin Templin, Secretary of the Endowment Association, the sum of \$661.79. I note further that there was an item of \$93.35 spent for gifts and remembrances for Mrs. Allen and me. I want you to know how greatly I appreciate this.

In Item 3 you state that Defense Bonds are to be converted at maturity into a scholarship fund, and so forth. You state further that in establishing the detailed arrangements for granting awards from this fund the committee shall give consideration to any recommendations which the honoree (F. C. Allen) shall submit.

If compatible with your wishes and desires, I would like to suggest that any part of the principal not be touched until the ten years have elapsed. If this wish is followed I would like to contribute \$88.21 to the net total of \$661.79. This would make a total of \$750.00, and this amount would purchase a One Thousand Dollar Bond, the redemption to take place in ten years. In this way a sizeable sum could be had, and since more than this amount was spent for gifts I would like to make this contribution.

May I state again that this gift is contingent upon the purchase of the \$750.00 bond and the bond shall run for the duration of ten years before being sold or discounted. If the committee and the Endowment Association and the officers of the University are agreeable to this plan please notify me and I will send you a check for this amount.

Dear Prof. Templin:

The committee in charge of the Phog Allen 25th Anniversary Celebration held March 6, 1942, places in your care the amount of \$661.79. The committee hopes that the sum will grow through contributions from persons who wish to express appreciation for the great service of Dr. Allen to the University of Kansas, as basketball coach.

The total amount of money received for the Phog Allen 25th Anniversary Celebration was \$817.32. From this \$155.53 was deducted for expenses and gifts. Of the expenses \$93.35 went for gifts to Dr. and Mrs. Allen, including the book of greetings, and \$62.18 for the cost of letters and expenses incurred in the pre-game ceremony.

In soliciting tangible expressions of appreciation of Dr. Allen's long period of service to the University, the committee announced definite plans for this fund which we desire to have filed in your office as a record of the transactions and as instructions for the future handling.

1. It was agreed that necessary expenses and special gifts to Dr. and Mrs. Allen were to be taken from the contributions.
2. The remaining sum and additional donations to this fund are to be invested in Defense Bonds.
3. The Defense Bonds are to be converted at maturity into a scholarship fund known as the F. C. Allen Scholarship to be administered by the University Committee on Aids and Awards. In establishing the detailed arrangements for granting awards from this fund, the committee shall give consideration to any recommendation which the honoree, Dr. F. C. Allen, shall submit.
4. If, following termination of the war before maturity of the bonds, there is apparent a vital need for additional scholarship funds, the Committee on Aids and Awards shall have authority to cash the bonds and make the money available immediately to provide scholarships.

5. The size and the principles of granting the scholarships shall be left to the discretion of the Committee on Aids and Awards. It is the desire of the Phog Allen celebration committee that the principal of the sum be used rather than to use only the income, and that the scholarships be on a loan basis. The committee hopes that the payment of loans and further contributions will keep the F. C. Allen Scholarship carried on in perpetuity.

Copies of this letter are being sent to the office of the Chancellor, to the Chairman of the Committee on Aids and Awards, and the alumni office for filing.
