The School of Education enrollment will be held in Room 206, Robinson Gymnasium, on Friday and Saturday, September 18 and 19, 1942. Enrollment will follow the College letter system.

The enrollment of each candidate for the Bachelor of Science degree in Education must be approved by the Education Advisor.

Graduate students in Education will report to the dean of the School of Education immediately after receiving enrollment materials from the Graduate Office.

Each candidate for the Teacher Training Program must obtain the approval of the Education Advisor on his professional program.

All assignments to Supervised Teaching sections are made by the Director of Supervised Teaching. Supervised teaching on the secondary school level is restricted to candidates approved by the Committee on Admissions and Guidance.

**Courses numbered 1-49 are open to Freshmen and Sophomores.**  
**Courses numbered 50-99 are open to Juniors and Seniors.**  
**Courses numbered 100-199 are open to Juniors, Seniors, and Graduates.**  
**Courses numbered 200-299 are open to Seniors and Graduates.**  
**Courses numbered 300-399 are open to Graduates only.**

#### INFORMATION ON THE TEACHER TRAINING PROGRAM

Requirements for the Teacher Training Program are available in mimeographed form in the office of the School of Education.

Candidates will begin their work with P50 and A50, then elect any two of the following three courses: H64, S52, and E50. This will constitute the Fundamentals Group. They will take



the teaching methods course and supervised teaching in their major subject, or in their minor. Students in the School of Education will elect nine additional hours of Education courses; students in other schools of the University will elect three hours.

Teacher Training Program requirements include, in addition to the Education courses listed above: General Psychology, 5 hours; Social Studies, 5 hours; Fundamentals of Speech, 2 hours; a major and a minor.

The completion of the Teacher Training Program qualifies the holder for a Kansas three-year-renewable-for-life certificate good on secondary level or below, such certificate being granted by the State Board of Education upon application.

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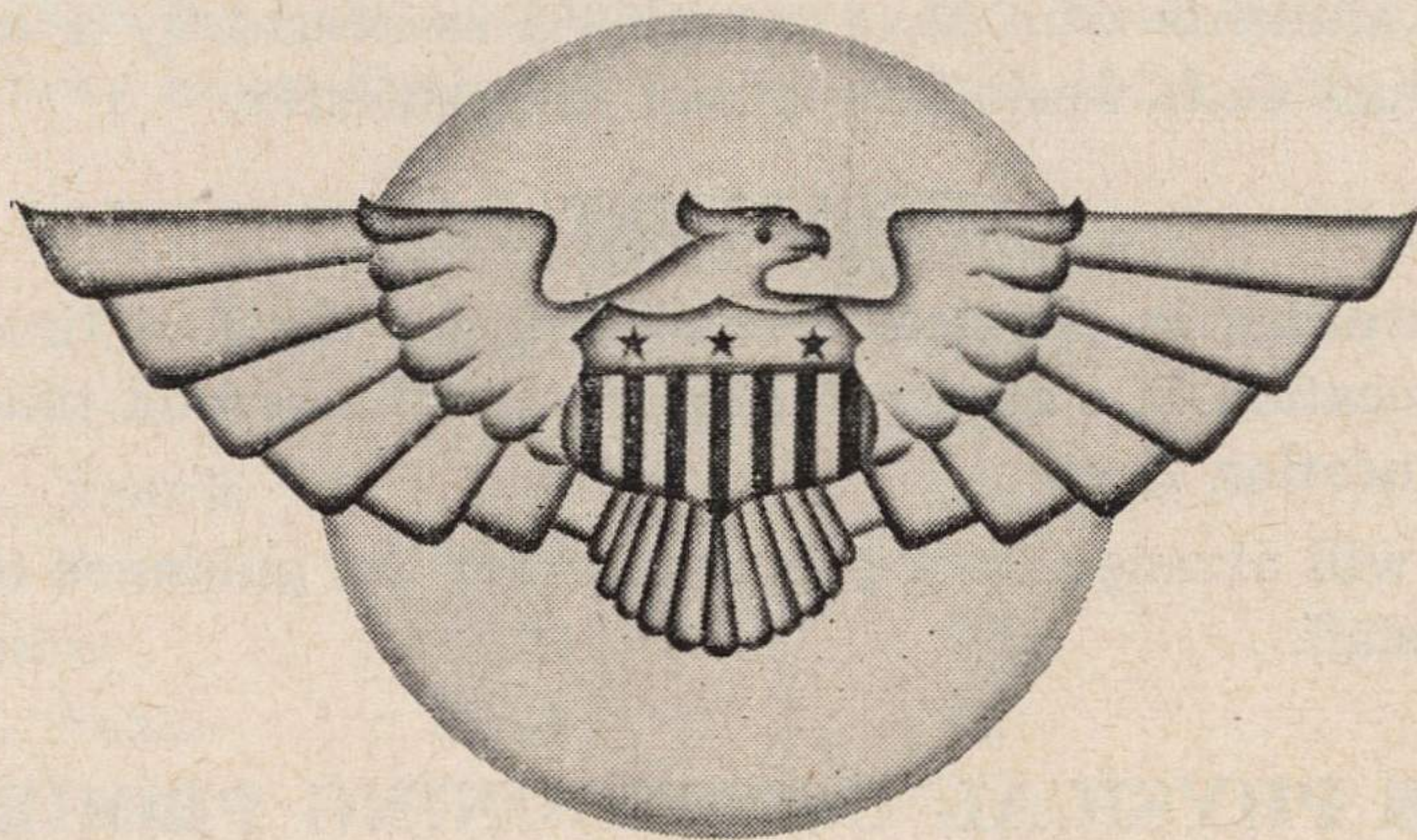

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## THE REQUIREMENT

During the present war emergency all **men** students at the University of Kansas who at the beginning of any semester are registered for Selective Service or are members of the various enlisted reserve services of the armed forces of the United States will be required to enroll in the University's physical conditioning program, offered by the Department of Physical Education. The program is optional for other men students.

**Women** students enrolling for the first time at the University of Kansas will be required to enroll in two semesters of physical conditioning. The program is optional for all other University women.

### CREDIT

Credit for physical conditioning will be given to students under the old regulations of the various schools. For instance, the College will continue to give a total of four semester hours, etc. In University divisions where credit is given for physical education one semester hour of credit will be given to those students who have completed satisfactorily a course which meets three hours each week throughout the semester.

### ENROLLMENT

A student enrolling in physical conditioning for the first time will enroll in Physical Education 1; a student enrolling for the second time will enroll in Physical Education 2, etc.

All students will arrange their program under the guidance of the Physical Education staff.

## MEN'S PHYSICAL CONDITIONING PROGRAM

All men will enroll in one of the sections of the conditioning course. During the first several weeks tests in swimming abilities will be conducted and anyone failing to pass the tests will transfer his enrollment to one section of the swimming classes.

**COMMITTEE ON PHYSICAL CONDITIONING PROGRAM**

The Senate of the University has appointed a special committee to administer the physical conditioning program, including granting of petitions for exemption for reasons of physical disability.



All male students ~~at the university~~ will be required to take three hours of physical education each week during each semester that the student is in the university, provided that ~~the~~ ~~he~~ is subject to service in the armed forces of the United States ~~and~~ (i.e. registered in the draft, in the V, VI, or VII program of the navy, in the R.O.T.C. or in the air service.) ~~For~~ a maximum of four semester hours ~~of~~ credit may be counted toward graduation.

The courses that a student will pursue under this program will be dependent upon the results of three examinations: (1) health examination (2) Swimming examination and (3) physical performance tests. Students who are certified by the health department as being physically fit must pass the swimming test. If a student is unable to pass this test he must ~~take~~ <sup>enroll in</sup> swimming. If he successfully passes the swimming test but does not pass the performance test, he will be enrolled in general physical education. If successful in passing both of these tests he may elect any of the optional courses offered by the department.

Students who have not taken <sup>the tests</sup> at enrollment time should enroll in ~~courses that they wish to elect~~ <sup>General Physical Education</sup>. They will ~~then be required to take the tests and~~ Tests will be given ~~and an opportunity to change to the optional~~ program given at an early date.

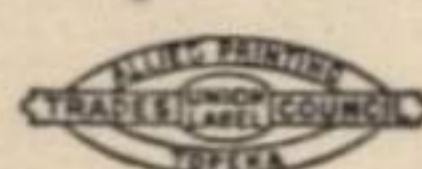

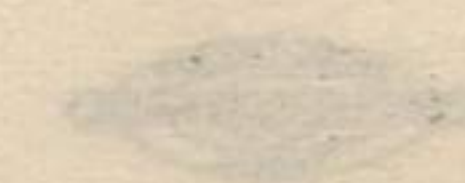

#### PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Physical Education activities may be elected by any student for one hour credit each semester. Four such credits may be counted toward graduation. The student may elect an outdoor activity for one half of the semester, and an indoor activity for the other half of the semester, or he may elect a single activity which is carried on throughout the entire semester.

A student enrolling in Physical Education for the first time will enroll in Physical Education 1; a student enrolling in Physical Education for the second time will enroll in Physical Education 2; a student enrolling in Physical Education for the third time will enroll in Physical Education 3; a student enrolling in Physical Education for the fourth time will enroll in Physical Education 4.

To fulfill the requirement for credit in Physical Education 1, 2, 3, or 4, the student, under the guidance of the Physical Education staff, may elect any of the following activities, in accordance with his interests and needs.
