and reporting on parolees, both from the courts and the institutions ions. In some other respects, Kentucky's correctional institutions are much behind what might be called normal progress in correctional work. I am quoting the Commissioners when I say this because they are very much in earnest trying to better the programs of the prisons and reformatories.
