The plan is that local alumni groups in Kansas each have the right to nominate a student for this award. The local group puts up \$50 ~~for~~ we match that \$50 with a similar amount from the central fund. We want the out of state alumni to put up the central fund. The Chicago alumni have already contributed over \$300 to this end we want to keep them going. A mimeographed statement regarding the fund is enclosed.

STUDENT AID PLAN of the K. U. ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

The general Alumni Association of the University of Kansas through its local chapters has started a program of assisting out-standing graduates of Kansas high schools in their desire to attend the University. The following points obtain:

1. What students.

- a. Both boys and girls.
- b. Only those who have shown ability and ambition by their high school careers to benefit themselves and the University by their attendance. Special interests and talents may be in any field.
- c. Only those who are undecided or who think it impossible to attend without help. This program is not to divert students from other colleges.

2. How it works.

The general Alumni Association office will furnish to each local alumni group a list of high school graduates with field of intended study shown for each student and with indication of desire to attend college, but indecision shown as to what college.

Each local alumni group will form a committee who will check its list of high school graduates with high school officials as to fitness for college work; then with the students themselves as to whether they are still undecided as to where they wish to go to college. After eliminating from the list all not recommended by high school officials and all planning to attend other colleges, the committee will talk with those remaining on the list and find more details of their ambitions, their resources, and their situation in general. These will be reported on forms furnished and sent to the alumni office at K.U.

Each alumni committee should do all possible to obtain correct information about courses available at the University for students interested, and should get other alumni and friends in its community to help worthy students in their efforts to obtain an education at K.U.

3. Alumni Loan Scholarships for Freshmen.

From a small amount of money contributed by alumni for loans and scholarships, now held by the K.U. Endowment Association, there is available enough funds to start in a modest way on the granting of "Alumni Loan Scholarships for Freshmen." Here are the regulations so far as they have been worked out:

Local alumni committees will nominate persons for these Freshmen loan awards on the basis of scholarship, character and promise of leadership in whatever career the student seems headed for. Need for financial assistance is taken for granted.

The K.U. Committee on Aids and Awards, of which Miss Wealthy Babcock is chairman, will have final approval of awards.

At present each Alumni Loan Scholarship for Freshmen will be for \$50.00 which will be a loan without interest until one year after leaving school. After the expiration of one year after leaving school it will draw interest at 4%.

Each local alumni group having the privilege of nominating an Alumni Scholar will be required to match the \$50.00 advanced from the fund in the Endowment Association with at least a similar amount. The matching money put up by local alumni must be contributed by one or more of the alumni, not taken from a local loan fund already in existence. The money given by the local group of alumni may be awarded either to the same student getting the assistance from the general fund as additional aid or may go to another student, or students. The money contributed by local groups will be sent in to the K.U. Endowment Association to be administered there under the same regulations as that now in the fund. In future years when it is repaid by students who have used it, such repayments will be added to the general Alumni Loan Scholarship Fund for Freshmen.

If a student is given an additional \$50.00 award by the local alumni, the second \$50.00 will be advanced to him at the beginning of the second semester, after enrollment. The first \$50.00 award will be advanced after enrollment but in time to pay fees for the first semester.

Each local alumni group will have the privilege of granting only one Alumni Loan Scholarship for Freshmen from the general fund. As many can be provided locally as desired.

The University Committee on Aids and Awards will make further regulations if any are needed under which prospective students nominated by alumni groups shall be approved for Alumni Loan Scholarships for Freshmen. It is known that the committee will likely require that each recipient rank in the upper 20% of his graduating class and will favor those who need financial help in getting an education.


Dear Mr. Allen:




Dear Dr. Allen:


Dear Dr. Allen :
