This is in reply to your letter of recent date regarding a speaking engagement at our Annual Lions Club Football Dinner.


The night of November 26 will be agreeable. The date has been definitely set for that night, and the dinner will be at 6:30 P. M.


Dear Sir:


We are certainly pleased that you will be able to be with us on November 26. The dinner will be strictly informal, and as I believe I told you, will begin at 6:30.
