contributed to the Research Quarterly, there have been fewer research contributions of standard quality. The policy of the Editorial Committee, headed by Dr. C. H. McCloy, and of Miss Mary Wibel, the Editor, has rightfully been to maintain the highest standard of quality. Consequently there is a need for many more worthwhile manuscripts to be submitted for publications. In your key position of leadership we hope you will:

a. Call to the attention of Miss Wibel any possible sources of research material;

b. Encourage publication of abstracts of good theses;

- c. Stimulate investigations with the viewpoint of possible publication; and
- d. Submit any research that you may have conducted recently.

We shall be grateful if you will bring these problems before your staff and student body now and in the early fall and spring. This letter is being sent to both men's and women's directors in all teacher education institutions in the United States where majors or minor curriculums have been established. In case you are not directly concerned, please pass the letter to the person most likely to give it attention.

All of your efforts are appreciated. With your help the affiliation of individuals in our field with their state, district, and national associations is now the greatest in history, despite the tremendous loss of personnel during these times and the elimination of practically all conventions. This achievement should give us a grand basis for more intense efforts after the war and should give every interested professional person a sense of satisfaction that his or her professional organization responded well during the emergency.
