College students may enroll in and receive credit for the following courses in the semester beginning July 1.

I. Courses listed in the School of Engineering or the Navy V-12 schedule as follows:

Mathematics—All courses listed. Students who have had one year of High School Algebra, but no College Algebra, should enroll in Math. Anal. I. Those with 1½ years of High School Algebra, but no College Algebra, should enroll in Math. Anal. III. Those who have College Algebra but no Trigonometry should enroll in Math. 3a. Those who have had College Algebra and Trigonometry should enroll in Math. Anal. II. Those who have had Analytics should enroll in Calculus I. Students without High School Geometry may enroll in Math. Anal. I

Physics-----All courses listed. General Chemistry IA is not open to students who have had Chemistry 2 or 2E, and General Chemistry 2A is not open to students who have had Chemistry 3 or 3E.

English-----All courses listed.

## DIRECTIONS TO STUDENTS

V-12 students must observe the following:

- 1. They must enroll in a minimum of 17 credit hours of work exclusive of Physical Training.
- 2. They must enroll in a Physical Training class which meets 5 days per week. These classes are scheduled at each hour from 8:30 to 11:30 inclusive and at 3:30. Students who do not already have four hours of credit in Physical Training should enroll for 1 hour of credit.
- 3. They must enroll in Comparative Anatomy if they are eligible to take it.
- 4. The following required courses, which are offered this semester, must be completed as soon as possible: English I and II; Chemistry IA.

  IIA, and General Organic Chemistry; Physics, one year.
- 5. If possible, they should enroll in the following electives which are a part of the V-12 program: Naval Organization, Historical Background of Present World War, and Psychology.

All civilian men must enroll in Physical Education, meeting at least three times per week, unless excused by the Committee on Exemptions (Dr. A. J. Mix, Chairman). This will count for one hour's credit for those who do not already hat four hours of credit in the subject.

Women who have entered the University since September 1, 1942 and who do not have two hours of credit in Physical Education must enroll in it, meeting three times per week, unless excused by the Committee on Exemptions.
