However, many of your subjects could not be used in the physical education curriculum. You apparently have a minor in mathematics. You will need 36 hours in physical education, 21 hours in education, plus general biology, zoology, physiology, human anatomy, fundamentals of speech and two more hours of English composition and literature, a total of 18 hours in addition to your education and physical education. Should you decide to embark on a program of physical education, you should transfer to the School of Education.
